RE: Supplemental Budget Ordinance Regarding Cable Television

Dear Councilmember Gruger:

Attached is a supplemental budget ordinance which, when adopted, will enable King County to conduct a formal cable television franchise renewal with TCI Cablevision of Washington, Inc. (TCI) and to challenge the cable television rate regulations recently promulgated by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). TCI places its equipment on County roads under the authority of long-term franchises granted by the County. TCI's franchises are expiring, and renewal negotiations between the County and TCI are deadlocked. Federal law provides that such deadlocks can be resolved through a formal request for proposal and a hearing process.

In addition, the FCC recently adopted rules for regulating cable television rates. Local governments are affected by and play a significant role in implementing those rules. The rules, as currently adopted, enable cable companies to directly pass through to subscribers the cost of benefits the community obtains in franchise renewals. The rules also permit a cable company to challenge rates based on the company's costs but do not allow a local government to reduce rates on the same basis.

The estimated costs for the formal franchise renewal total \$534,612.00. Over \$520,000 of these costs is for outside consultant services; the remainder is to cover expenses that will be incurred by the Office of Cable Communications in connection

I am also proposing that \$25,000 be allocated to challenge the FCC's cable television rate regulations. The total cost of challenging the regulations will be up to \$100,000, which consists entirely of outside legal services. The County should seek other counties and cities to join in this effort, and to share the financial burden of the challenge.

The Cable Television Refranchising Oversight Committee, which includes Council representation, has reviewed and approved the decision to proceed using a formal renewal process, and funds for these projects have been mutually identified with Councilmember Sims.

Funding for this appropriation will temporarily come from the Current Expense transfer to CIP funds. In order to backfill this loss, the newly formed Major Maintenance Reserve Fund will appropriate the same amount to CIP transfers from revenue to be received from the State related to the Initiative 62 lawsuit. This source will also be reimbursed once the cable contract is renewed.

I recommend that the proposed ordinance be adopted by the Council. Thank you.

### KING COUNTY COUNCIL - CABLE FRANCHISE HEARING, JUNE 14, 1993

On behalf of the Community and Technical Colleges, I would like to thank you for the opportunity to address you today.

The Community and Technical Colleges look forward to the time when we can provide "Demand Site Instruction." This means instruction when and where it is needed.

To reach this goal, our needs include:

- Two dedicated cable channels with option to additional channels when 80% capacity of prime time is filled.
- A two-way audio, video (fiber) network linking all six community and technical colleges
  whose service area lies within the franchise area. This network should also include K-12
  and four institutions necessary for articulation of course delivery and educational services.
- The two-way network, or institutional network (I-Net), must interface with an identical network in the Seattle and Bellevue franchise areas. Ten colleges would then be linked for "course sharing", inservice and administrative needs. Other adjacent I Net systems should be linked as they are developed.
- All six colleges need to be origination sites for the I Net and cable channels in order to share local culturally diverse programming and to provide equal access to students.
- Internal fiber systems need to be developed on each campus to originate a variety of classes and cultural programming.
- Studio upgrade is necessary at Shoreline Community College and remote equipment at Green River Community College. These production resources would be shared with other colleges.
