ordinance no. 11040

AN ORDINANCE relating to drug-free zones; approving maps of the location and boundaries of areas in the Tahoma School District No. 409 within which unlawful transactions in controlled substances are subject to enhanced penalties pursuant to RCW 69.50.435, and adding a new section to K.C.C. 12.82.

PREAMBLE:

K.C.C. 12.82 establishes a procedure for the production or reproduction of maps depicting the location and boundaries of parks, schools and areas within one thousand feet of schools, within which unlawful transactions in controlled substances are subject to enhanced penalties as imposed pursuant to RCW 69.50.435. Upon request of the governing body of the Tahoma School District No. 409, King County has prepared maps depicting such boundaries. It is in the public interest to provide notice of the location of such areas and to expedite prosecution, conviction, and enhanced penalties for cases of unlawful transactions in controlled substances in such locations.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1: The boundaries of drug-free zones surrounding the following schools as listed in Exhibits "A" through "G" located within the Tahoma School District No. 409 are hereby adopted:

- A. Cedar River Elementary School and Shadow Lake Elementary School.
 - B. Glacier Park Elementary School.
 - C. Lake Wilderness Elementary School.
- D. Rock Creek Elementary School and Central Services Center.
- E. Maple Valley High School and Maintenance and Transportation Center.
 - F. Tahoma Junior High School.
 - G. Tahoma Senior High School.
