ORDINANCE NO. 1115

AN ORDINANCE establishing a dog control zone throughout unincorporated urban King County and adding a new section to Ordinance No. 3548 and K.C.C 11.08.

SECTION 1. Findings. The King County council finds that the establishment of a dog control zone in King County is necessary for the following reasons:

- A. The protection of dogs and other domestic animals from dogs at large or without restraint;
- B. The preservation of private property rights from unlawful trespass by dogs at large or without restraint;
- C. The preservation, protection and maintenance of public property and public amenities such as parks, schools and playgrounds from the waste products generated by dogs at large or without restraint;
- D. The prevention of unintentional loss of dogs at large or without restraint due to their becoming lost or being struck by vehicular traffic; and
- E. The protection of pedestrians and bicyclists from dogs at large or without restraint.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. There is added to Ordinance No. 3548 and K.C.C 11.08 a new section to read as follows:

Dog Control Zone - urban areas of King County.

In addition to the dog control zones already in effect 1 under the provisions of this chapter, there is created a dog control zone in the following zoning districts of unincorporated King County designated urban as defined in K.C.C. 21: SE, SC, SR/RS15000, SR/RS9600, RS7200, SR5000, RMHP, 5 RD3600, RM2400, RT, RM1800, RM900, RM900P, BN, BR-N, B-C, C-G, 6 M-L, M-P, and M-H; or as defined in K.C.C. 21A: R-1 through R-48, O, NB, RB, CB, and I. 8 SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 3548, Section 1, and K.C.C. 11.08.030 are hereby amended to read as follows: Dogs at large 10 prohibited in dog control zones.
