AN ORDINANCE relating to paid leave for donation of bone marrow and other life giving activities, allowing time off from work without the use of sick or annual leave, and adding a new section to K.C.C. 3.12.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE METROPOLITAN KING COUNTY COUNCIL:

Findings. The Metropolitan King County SECTION 1. council finds that allowing employees to take time off from their regular employment to donate bone marrow, kidneys, blood and engage voluntarily in other life-giving procedures for needy individuals in danger of dying from their medical conditions is laudable. The Metropolitan King County council further finds that these employees are to be actively encourage in these altruistic pursuits and that allowing these employees to engage in giving the gift of life serves the public good. Engaging in this life-affirming public purpose should not entail having the participating employees penalized by requiring them to use either family, sick, or annual leave or having to take leave without pay. Voluntary donation of medically necessary blood, organs, fluids, tissues and other human body components is an essential element of the efficient delivery of medical services to the citizens of King County. Encouraging county employees to make such donations reduces the cost of public medical services, including those provided by the county public hospital, Harborview Medical Center. reduces the severity and length of many forms of injury and illness by making available suitable supplies of these substances, thereby promoting the public health and safety of the public.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 2. Definitions. "Life-giving and life-saving procedures" shall mean a medically-supervised procedure involving the testing, sampling, or donation of blood, organs, fluids, tissues and other human body components for the purposes of donation without compensation to a person for a medically necessary treatment.

SECTION 3. Leave for participating in life-saving and life-giving procedures. A. The appointing authority shall allow employees voluntarily participating as donors in life-giving or life-saving procedures such as, but not limited to, bone marrow transplants, kidney transplants, or blood transfusions to take five days paid leave without having such leave charged to family leave, sick leave, annual leave or leave without pay provided that the employee shall:

- 1. Give the appointing authority reasonable advance notice of the need to take time off from work for the donation of bone marrow, a kidney or blood where there is a reasonable expectation that the employee's failure to donate may result in serious illness, injury, pain or the eventual death of the identified recipient.
- 2. Provide written proof from an accredited medical institution, organization or individual as to the need for the employee to donate bone marrow, a kidney, or blood or to participate in any other medical procedure where the participation of the donor is unique or critical to a successful outcome.
