

ORDINANCE NO. **11312**

AN ORDINANCE relating to drug-free zones; approving a map of the location and boundary of areas surrounding St. Luke and Holy Family Schools within the Catholic Archdiocese within which unlawful transactions in controlled substances are subject to enhanced penalties pursuant to RCW 69.50.435, and amending Ordinance 10393, Section 1, as amended and K.C.C. 12.82.070.

PREAMBLE:

K.C.C. 12.82 establishes a procedure for the production or reproduction of maps depicting the location and boundaries of parks, schools and areas within one thousand feet of schools, within which unlawful transactions in controlled substances are subject to enhanced penalties as imposed pursuant to RCW 69.50.435. Upon request of the governing body of the Catholic Archdiocese, King County has prepared a map depicting such boundaries. It is in the public interest to provide notice of the location of such areas and to expedite prosecution, conviction, and enhanced penalties for cases of unlawful transactions in controlled substances in such locations.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1: Ordinance 10393, Section 1 as amended, and K.C.C.

12.82.070, are hereby amended to read as follows:

The boundaries of drug-free zones surrounding the following schools as listed in exhibits A - ((D)) F located within the Catholic Archdiocese are hereby adopted for:.

- A. John F. Kennedy Memorial High School; and
- B. St. Francis of Assisi Elementary School;
- C. St. Bernadette Elementary School.
- D. Eastside Catholic High School.
- E. St. Luke School
- F. Holy Family School
