ORDINANCE NO. **11411**

AN ORDINANCE relating to the change of  
name of Federal Way Water and Sewer  
District to "Lakehaven Utility District".

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Findings. The King County Council hereby  
makes the following findings:

A. The Board of Commissioners of Federal Way Water and  
Sewer District, King County, Washington State, has determined  
that it would be in the best interest of the district to  
change its name to "Lakehaven Utility District" since the  
district's current name tends to confuse customers and others  
that a legal or other connection exists between the District  
and City of Federal Way.

B. The district filed Resolution No. 94-749 with the  
King County Council, resolving to change the name of the  
district from Federal Way Water and Sewer District to  
"Lakehaven Utility District" to eliminate the existence of  
any such confusion and to recognize the many rate payers  
residing in areas other than those included within the  
corporate boundaries of the City of Federal Way.

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SECTION 2. The King County Council, pursuant to RCW 56.08.015, approves the change in name of Federal Way Water and Sewer District to "Lakehaven Utility District".

INTRODUCED AND READ for the first time this 20<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1994.

Resolution No. 94 - 749

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Commissioners of Federal Way Water and Sewer District, King County, Washington, changing, subject to approval by King County, the official name of the District from the "Federal Way Water and Sewer District" to the "Lakehaven Utility District" and superseding and canceling Federal Way Water and Sewer District Resolution No. 86-079.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the merger of King County Water District No. 124 into the Lakehaven Sewer District, the Board of Commissioners adopted "Federal Way Water and Sewer District" as the official name of the municipal sewer and water utility, and

WHEREAS, after the incorporation of the City of Federal Way, the District has found that the District's current name tends to confuse customers and others that a legal or other connection exists between the District and the City of Federal Way, and

WHEREAS, the Board wishing to eliminate the existence of any such confusion and to recognize the many ratepayers residing in areas other than those included within the corporate boundaries of the City of Federal Way,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. Subject to, and effective upon, the approval by the King County Council, and pursuant to the authority and requirements for same set forth in RCW 56.08.015, the name of the municipal corporation presently known as the "Federal Way Water and Sewer District" shall be changed and the municipal entity shall thereafter be known and referred to as the "Lakehaven Utility District".
2. The Board hereby directs that a certified copy of this resolution be sent to the King County Council along with a request for a timely approval.
3. Upon approval, the District shall continue to use all existing stationary and any other items containing or depicting the name "Federal Way Water and Sewer District" or "Federal Way Water and Sewer", until supplies no longer exist or until such time as it would be otherwise efficient to affix the new name to any item.
4. Upon approval, a public notice of the name change shall be published and the District shall take such other steps as are deemed appropriate to notify customers and other members of the public of the name change.

ADOPTED by the Board of Commissioners of Federal Way Water and Sewer District, King County, Washington, at a regular meeting thereof held this 16th day of May, 1994.
