ORDINANCE NO. **11455**

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the creation of a
new 1989 Open Space Bond Tibbetts Valley
Trailhead Project.

PREAMBLE:

1. The City of Issaquah has abandoned the 1989 Open Space Bond Squak/Issaquah Creek Trail Access and Cougar Mountain Access Projects.
2. The King County Open Space Citizen Oversight Committee has recommended the creation of a Tibbetts Valley Trailhead Project.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is approved and adopted the creation of the City of Issaquah 1989 Open Space Bond Tibbetts Valley Trailhead project.

INTRODUCED AND READ for the first time this 18th day of July, 1994.

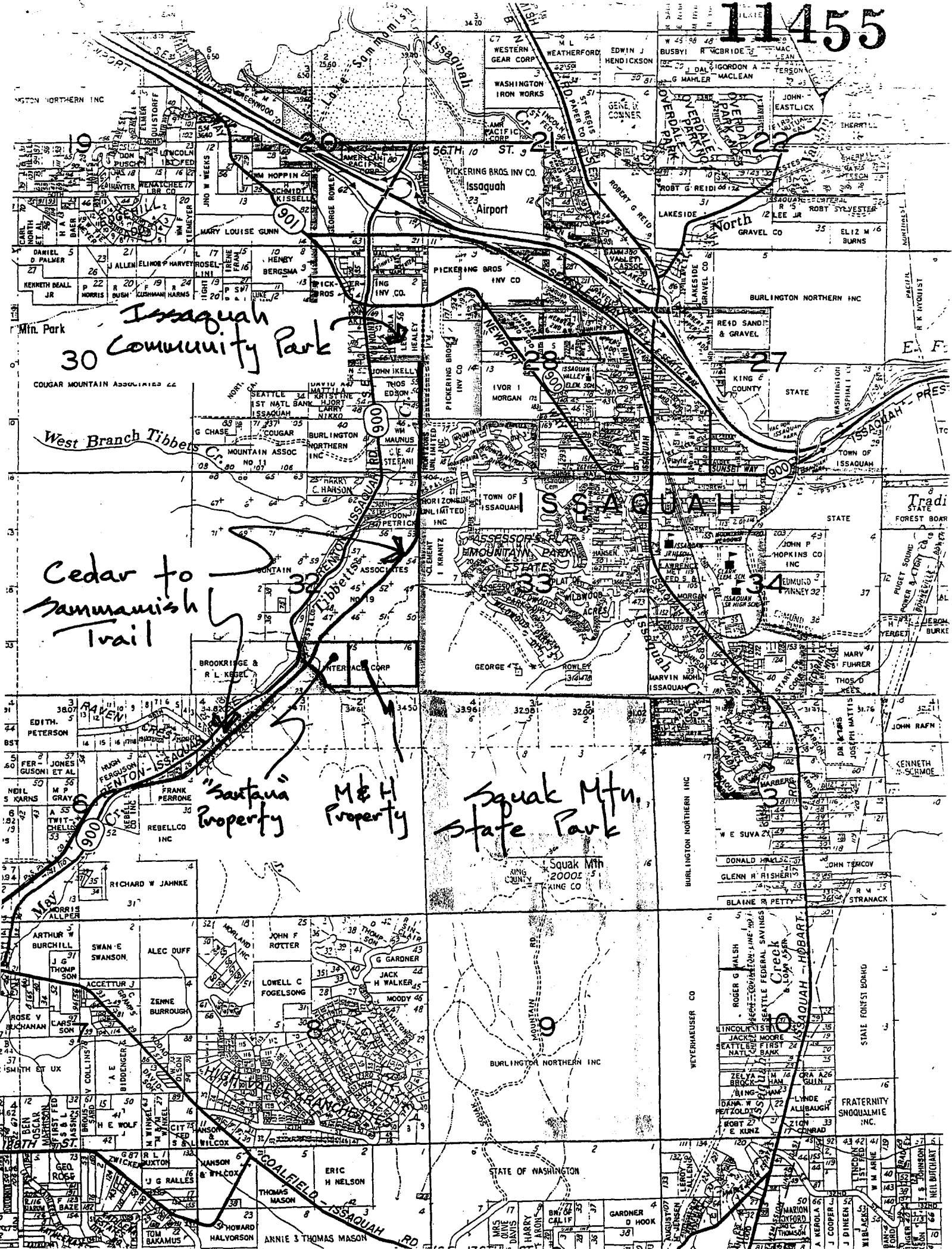

4 A RESOLUTION recommending the creation of a
5 new City of Issaquah 1989 Open Space Bond
6 Tibbetts Valley Trailhead Project and the
7 reallocation of unexpended funds from the
8 Squak/Issaquah Creek Trail Access and Cougar
9 Mountain Access Projects to the newly-
10 created Tibbetts Valley Trailhead Project.

11 WHEREAS, by Section 11 of the King County Ordinance 9071 the
12 King County Council directed the establishment of the Open Space
13 Citizen Oversight Committee, within one year of the passage of
14 the Ordinance by the qualified electors of the county in the
15 November 7, 1989 general election; and,

16 WHEREAS, on November 7, 1989, Ordinance 9071 was passed by
17 greater than 60% of the qualified electors; and

18 WHEREAS, on April 4, 1990, the King County Council passed
19 Motion 7886, which established the King County Citizen Oversight
20 Committee to consider and address the concerns, needs and
21 progress of all jurisdictions responsible for implementing
22 Ordinance 9071; and

23 WHEREAS, by Ordinance 9071 the King County Council finds and
24 declares that "public green spaces, green belts, open space,
25 parks and trails acquired or improved pursuant to this ordinance,
26 together with existing lands and facilities set aside for these
27 purposes, will constitute a necessary system of public green
28 spaces, greenbelts, open space, parks and trails for the county
29 and its residents"; and

30 WHEREAS, the City of Issaquah passed a motion on May 16, 1994
31 (attached hereto as Exhibit A), to abandon the Squak/Issaquah
32 Creek Trail Access and Cougar Mountain Access projects and
33 reallocate unexpended bond proceeds of \$408,014 to the new
34 Tibbetts Valley Trailhead Site project; and

1 WHEREAS, the City of Issaquah has determined that the
2 Tibbetts Valley Trailhead Site project fulfills the intent of the
3 1989 Open Space Bond;

4 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the King County Open Space
5 Citizen Oversight Committee:

6 A. The Committee hereby recommends the creation of a new
7 City of Issaquah 1989 Open Space Bond Tibbetts Valley Trailhead
8 Site Project;

9 B. The Committee further recommends reallocation of
10 unexpended bond proceeds from the Squak/Issaquah Creek Trail
11 Access and Cougar Mountain Access Projects to the newly-created
12 Tibbetts Valley Trailhead Site Project.
