ORDINANCE NO. 11490

AN ORDINANCE approving the King County Executive's declaration of emergency with respect to the procurement of services to repair, restore and re-open the Kingdome facilities; waiving requirements for competitive bidding and formal solicitation; waiving minority and women's business enterprises requirements; waiving the requirements for the selection and award of a professional/technical service consultant contracts; and authorizing the Executive to contract directly on an emergency basis to procure services for the repair and restoration of the Kingdome in order to open the Kingdome in an expeditious and safe manner; appropriating \$34.0 million to the Building Repair and Replacement Fund to correct physical damages related to the ceiling and roof of the Stadium, amending Ordinance 11130, Section 117 and Attachment 2, as amended, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Findings of Fact:

- A. Current and emergent situation created by the closure of the Kingdome facilities continues to impose adverse economic impacts on the King County community; and
- B. The county and the Kingdome tenants have incurred financial losses due to the postponement and relocation of scheduled events; and
- C. The county and Kingdome tenants may continue to incur substantial financial losses while the Kingdome remains closed; and
- D. On advice of the county's engineering consultants, an integrated and coordinated approach to repair of the Kingdome is necessary to ensure efficient and effective corrective action; and

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- E. The county must proceed without delay to initiate an overall approach to achieve an integrated and coordinated repair to, and restoration of, the Kingdome facilities to reopen the facilities to the public and tenants and to provide a safe venue for future events; and
- F. To achieve such a coordinated and integrated approach to any repair, a complete infrastructure study of Kingdome facilities is necessary; and
- G. It is necessary to waive competitive bidding and formal solicitation requirements and minority and women's business enterprises requirements associated with contracts to assess and address the integrated and coordinated repair of the Kingdome facilities and work necessary to restore public confidence in the Kingdome facilities; and
- H. These contracts are expected to exceed existing Kingdome budget contingencies and the appropriations established in Ordinance No. 11444; and
- I. King County Executive Gary Locke issued a Declaration of Emergency on August 26, 1994 calling for the "immediate commencement of work to repair and restore the Kingdome facilities"; and
- J. On September 2, 1994 the county executive submitted an emergency ordinance seeking the appropriation of \$34.0 million to the Building Repair and Replacement Fund for work needed to re-open the Kingdome in time for the Seahawk home game on November 6, 1994; and
- K. The council's Budget and Fiscal Management Committee conducted hearings on the proposed appropriation request on September 7, 8, 9 and 12 to expedite council review; and
- L. The executive has certified that adequate funds are available to implement the ordinance, and has identified five "potential sources of debt service" including an increase in the motor vehicle lease tax, re-programming the hotel/motel

 tax revenues shared with local arts programs, diverting additional state sales taxes to the hotel/motel tax, implementing a new 5% Kingdome use fee on ticket sales, and refunding to the county state sales and B&O taxes on the Kingdome re-construction; and

- M. Each of the five potential debt service funding sources identified by the executive must first be authorized by the 1995 Legislature to meet 1996 debt service obligations; and
- N. The executive and the acting Kingdome director have testified that the proposed roof and ceiling repair work will have a useful service life of 25 years; and
- O. The executive and the acting Kingdome director have testified that all of the proposed repair work will be certified by a professional engineer registered by the State of Washington and backed by the engineer's "errors and omissions" insurance coverage.

SECTION 2. The council hereby approves the King County executive's declaration of emergency dated August 26, 1994. An emergency exists in which the public interest or property of the county would suffer material injury or damage by delay and therefore the competitive selection and bidding requirements of K.C.C. 4.16 and state law and the Minority and Women Business Enterprise requirements of K.C.C. 4.18 are hereby waived with respect to all contracts needed to evaluate and repair Kingdome facilities in order to re-open the facility as soon as possible.

SECTION 3. The department of stadium administration shall be responsible for the management of all capital improvement projects associated with the Kingdome.

SECTION 4. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$34.0 million to the Building Repair and Replacement Fund to correct physical damages related to the

interior roof of the Stadium. It is the intent of the council to issue limited general obligation bonds to cover \$32.5 million in ceiling and roof repair costs with interim financing from bond anticipation notes; the council requests the executive to repay the additional \$1.5 million cost of the infrastructure study in the 1995 current expense budget.

PROVIDED THAT:

This appropriation is subject to the following conditions:

A. At the request of the Budget and Fiscal Management Committee Chair, the executive or the acting Kingdome director shall appear before and present a weekly written and oral report to the council's Budget and Fiscal Management Committee on the progress of Kingdome repairs and expenditures, and demonstrate compliance with the following milestones established in the work plan proposed by the acting Kingdome director:

Committee Meeting September 21, 1994:

Interior ceiling prep work/tension ring Quad 1
Interior ceiling prep work/tension ring Quad 3
Committee Meeting October 5, 1994:

Interior ceiling prep work/tension ring Quad 2
Interior ceiling prep work/tension ring Quad 4
Committee Meeting October 12, 1994:

Installation of ceiling/coating materials and K-13 spray

Committee Meeting October 19, 1994:

Completion of exterior roof

B. One county auditor shall be assigned to the Kingdome project for the duration of the repair project to provide a weekly, independent accounting of repair expenses. The auditor shall provide a weekly written report of repair expenditures to the Budget and Fiscal Management Committee.

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C. To the extent possible given the repair schedule limitations, the executive should attempt to meet the county Minority and Women Business Enterprise participation goals pursuant to K.C.C. 4.18, but this proviso shall in no way be deemed to conflict with section 2 of this ordinance or give rise to a cause of action by any minority or women's business enterprise.

- D. The acting Kingdome director shall prepare an estimate of the annual maintenance and repair costs for the new ceiling, roofing and roof drainage system and submit a financial analysis to the council's Budget and Fiscal Management Committee on or before October 14, 1994.
- E. The executive shall submit written documentation from the two professional sport tenants that the proposed ceiling and acoustical treatments have been accepted. Written approvals shall be submitted to the council chair on or before October 7, 1994.
- The executive shall appoint, subject to council confirmation, individuals to develop a financial plan necessary to fund the Kingdome repair plan on a Kingdome Financing Commission. The Commission should be comprised of county executive or his designee, at least Metropolitan King County councilmembers, three State House and three State Senate representatives from the Legislature including at least one minority party representative from each body, two representatives from the city of Seattle and two representatives appointed by the Suburban Association, at least three representatives of Kingdome at least four representatives from tenants, the arts community and at least four representatives from the Hotel/Motel business community. The chair shall be appointed by the county executive subject to confirmation by council.

G. The executive is requested to provide a \$3.3 million Kingdome contingency fund in the 1995 current expense budget to repay the \$1.5 million infrastructure study costs and to fund up to \$1.8 million for other unanticipated Kingdome repair work. This \$3.3 million reserve is equivalent to the annual debt service needed in 1996 to make payments on the \$32.5 million bond issue for ceiling and roof repairs in the event that the 1995 Legislature does not provide new stadium revenues.

- H. The executive is requested to immediately appoint an Architect of Record to develop a work plan for other infrastructure improvements which may be needed to make the Kingdome a fully useable facility. The Architect of Record shall identify any needed improvements to lighting, sound, drainage, HVAC, plumbing, electrical distribution and other infrastructure improvements in a written report to be submitted to the council in the first quarter of 1995.
- I. The executive shall submit a plan to restore \$4 million taken from the Insurance Fund for emergency repairs to the Kingdome to the Budget and Fiscal Management Committee on or before October 7, 1994.
- J. The executive shall analyze opportunities for corporate sponsorships of the Kingdome, or other means of generating new revenue from the facility, with a goal of bringing at least \$1 million in new revenues to the Kingdome operating budget in 1995.

SECTION 5. Ordinance No. 11130, Section 117, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein following:

From several capital improvements project funds there are hereby appropriated and authorized to be disbursed the following amounts for the specific projects identified in Attachment No. 2 of this ordinance.
