AN ORDINANCE authorizing expansion of the City of Auburn 1993 Regional Conservation Futures Acquisition Program Green River Access Project.

PREAMBLE:

- 1. The City of Auburn has completed the 1993 Regional Conservation Futures Acquisition Program Olson Canyon and Green River Access projects.
- 2. The City of Auburn has an opportunity to add 1,310 feet of waterfront with the purchase of an additional property adjacent to the Green River Access Project.
- 2. The King County Open Space Citizen Oversight Committee has recommended the expansion of the scope of the 1993 Regional Conservation Futures Acquisition Program Green River Access Project to include this additional property.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is approved and adopted the expansion of the City of Auburn 1993 Regional Conservation Futures Acquisition Program Green River Access Project to include the property depicted on the attached map.

INTRODUCED AND READ for the first time this 21st day of November, 1994.

10 WHEREAS, by Section 11 of the King County Ordinance 9071 the
11 King County Council directed the establishment of the King County
12 Open Space Citizen Oversight Committee (Committee), within one
13 year of the passage of the Ordinance by the qualified electors of
14 the county in the November 7, 1989 general election; and

15 WHEREAS, on November 7, 1989, Ordinance 9071 was passed by
16 greater than 60% of the qualified electors; and

17 WHEREAS, on April 4, 1990, the King County Council passed
18 Motion 7886, which established the Committee to consider and
19 address the concerns, needs and progress of all jurisdictions
20 responsible for implementing Ordinance 9071 and to make
21 recommendation on such other requests as transmitted to the
22 committee from time to time by the Executive or Council on
23 important matters relating to open space in King County; and

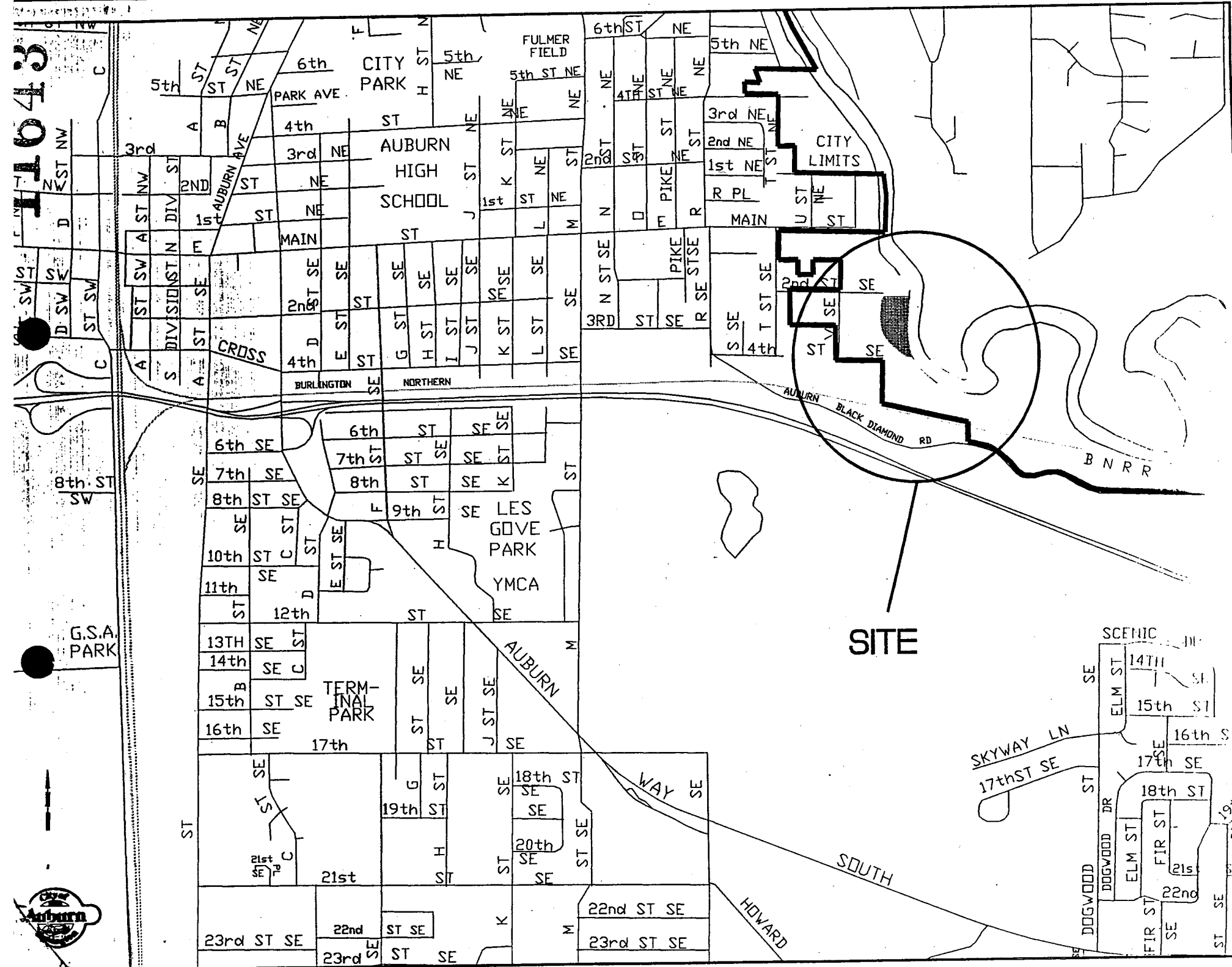
24 WHEREAS, by Ordinance 11068 and 11130, King County funded the
25 1993 Regional Conservation Futures Acquisition Program; and

26 WHEREAS, the City of Auburn has completed its Olson Canyon
27 and original Green River Access projects within the 1993 Regional
28 Conservation Futures Acquisition Program; and

29 WHEREAS, the City of Auburn has unexpended funds remaining in
30 the Olson Canyon and original Green River Access projects;

31 WHEREAS, the City of Auburn has an opportunity to expand the
32 Green River Access Project by purchasing two properties providing
