ORDINANCE NO. 11701

AN ORDINANCE relating to the nomination and appointment of members of the Harborview Medical Center Board of Trustees, providing for the nomination of one trustee by each councilmember, and amending Ordinance 6818, Section 5 and K.C.C. 2.42.040.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Findings. The council finds that a number of boards and commissions, including the Harborview Medical Center Board of Trustees, have had the number of members established in part in relation to the prior nine county council districts. The council finds that the expansion of the metropolitan county council from nine to thirteen members results in the need to modify the method of appointment to the board to reflect this change and to ensure broad participation and representation from all areas of King County.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 6818, Section 5 and K.C.C. 2.42.040 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Board of Trustees - Appointment and Confirmation -Qualification - Compensation.

Appointment and Confirmation. Board members shall be appointed to positions numbered one through thirteen (1-13). The executive shall appoint the members of the board subject to confirmation by a majority of the council.

Provided that:

((The executive shall appoint four board members at large. Of the remaining nine appointments, one shall be made from each council district.)) A candidate for each position must be recommended by the councilmember representing the council district with the corresponding number. If the executive does not appoint the person recommended by the councilmember, the executive shall request that the councilmember recommend another person.

B. Qualification. In making appointments to the board, an effort should be made to assure that diverse geographic. social, cultural, ethnic, racial, and economic backgrounds and perspectives are considered. Candidates should possess demonstrated leadership ability, and recognized experience in management/administration, planning, finance, health service delivery, consumer representation or institutional operation; and the ability to work cooperatively with others of diverse backgrounds and philosophies. Additionally, all candidates must be willing to commit to the amount of time necessary to perform trustee duties, serve on board committees and serve as an advocate for the medical center.

C. Ineligibility. No person shall be eligible for appointment as a member of the board who holds or has held during the period of two years immediately prior to appointment, any salaried office or position in any office, department or branch of county government or of any organization with which a contract for the operation and administration of the medical center has been executed. All candidates will be required to disclose any information concerning actions or activities of the candidate or his/her immediate family which present a potential conflict of

officials to be in conflict with the interests of the medical center, will be ineligible for board membership.

Compensation. No board member shall receive any compensation or emolument whatever for services as a board member and shall be governed by the county code of ethics and state law regarding conflict of interest. Board members may be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060 as now existing or hereafter amended.

SECTION 3. Transition.

- Each position which is not currently an at-large position shall be designated position number one through nine (1-9) to correspond with the council district number from which the board member was nominated.
- The four current at-large positions shall be numbered as follows:
- The position currently held by William H. Conner, the term for which expired on April 16, 1994, shall be numbered position 10. Upon the expiration of the term of an appointee to position 10 or the occurrence of a vacancy, the councilmember from district 10 shall make a nomination for this position in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.A.
- The position currently held by Marilyn Ward shall be numbered position 11. Upon the expiration of the term of an appointee to position 11 or the occurrence of a vacancy., the councilmember from district 11 shall make a nomination for this position in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.A.
- The position currently held by J. Thomas Ranken shall be numbered position 12. Upon the expiration of the

term of an appointee to position 12 or the occurrence of a vacancy, the councilmember from district 12 shall make a nomination for this position in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.A
