ORDINANCE NO. 11767

AN ORDINANCE approving the King County Executive's declaration of emergency with respect to the procurement of equipment and services to provide security to the King County Courthouse; waiving requirements for competitive bidding and formal solicitation; waiving minority and women's business enterprises requirements; waiving the requirements for the selection and award of professional/technical service consultant contracts; and authorizing the Executive to contract directly on an emergency basis to procure equipment and services for the provision of security to the King County Courthouse in order to continue with interim entrance screening efforts in an expeditious and safe manner; and declaring an emergency.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

## **SECTION 1.** Statement of findings:

- A. King County Executive Gary Locke issued a Declaration of Emergency on March 31, 1995, confirming the interim period in which to secure the King County courthouse by screening for weapons at all entrances to the building;
- B. On March 3, 1995, the county executive submitted an emergency ordinance seeking the appropriation of \$412,000 for work related to the implementation of entrance screening at the King County courthouse;
  - C. On March 6, 1995, the county council approved the emergency ordinance;
- D. Ordinance 11702 and Motion 9493, passed on March 6, 1995, call for the use of expert consultants for several studies related to courthouse security and the procurement of equipment and contract staff services related to entrance screening;
- E. Use of the ordinary process for bidding of contracts to perform the necessary work associated with provision of security would require the solicitation of competitive bids and the evaluation of those bids, a process which could not be performed simultaneously or overlapped to achieve any significant savings of time;
- F. Use of an expedited contract award process, use of telephone bids and existing competitively selected contracts and purchase orders for services allows the project to continue without interruption for the interim period.

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The King County council approves the SECTION 2. A. continued expenditure of amounts in excess of \$50,000 to each contractor or consultant consistent with the provisions of K.C.C. 4.16.050 for the purpose of the continuing provision of courthouse security on an interim basis; provided that no later than May 5, 1995, the executive shall have submitted to the council for its consideration and adoption a plan for permanent courthouse screening consistent with the requirements of Ordinance No. 11072. SECTION 3. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health or safety or for the support of county government and its existing public institutions.
