AN ORDINANCE authorizing the county executive to execute Agreements with the State of Washington Department of Natural Resources and the Mountains to Sound Greenway Trust for acquisition and transfer of surplus forest land and the application of biosolids within King County.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of King County: SECTION 1. Findings.

- A. The King County Council, by its Motion No. 9472 on January 23, 1995 authorized the development of an agreement with the State Department of Natural Resources and Mountains to Sound Greenway Trust to acquire strategic forest lands within the "Greenway" along the Interstate 90 corridor between Snoqualmie Pass and Puget Sound, and to restore selected forest lands by applying biosolids to these lands.
- B. The goals of King County, by and through its water pollution control division (hereinafter called "WPCD" or its successor) are to provide for short term biosolids application lands by accepting the proposal from the Weyerhaeuser Company for additional biosolids application lands and to provide for long term biosolids application rights by entering into an agreement with the Department of Natural Resources and the Mountains to Sound Greenway Trust that will result in enhanced forest soils, tree growth, wildlife habitat, and water quality within King County at an economic advantage to the sewer rate payers and taxpayers for the County.
- C. MTS will manage a six year public education and outreach program on the safety of and ecological necessity for biosolids recycling and on the environmental and economic effects of maintaining sustainable commercial forests.
- D. The lands conveyed to Department of Natural Resources will be managed in accordance with the State's Forest Resource Plan.

- E. Department of Natural Resources will make available, for the term of this contract and any extensions, at least 3600 acres within King County to WPCD for biosolids application.
- F. WPCD will receive sixty percent of the harvest receipts from the WPCD Trust Lands which will be reserved for WPCD or its successor divisions. Nothing shall prevent the use of funds for the purchase of additional biosolids application lands consistent with the terms of the Agreement. Fifteen percent of the harvest receipts will be distributed to King County taxing agencies, or, upon the recommendation of the Council, the 15% proceeds may be applied to purposes that are consistent with this Agreement and the County's environmental, open space, or growth management policies. Department of Natural Resources will retain 25% of the harvest receipts from the WPCD Trust Lands for managing the lands and timber.
- G. It is in the best interest of the County and its people to transfer and convey certain specified parcels of land to the Department of Natural Resources in trust to accomplish the purposes herein.
- H. For the purposes of intergovernmental transfer, these properties are deemed to be surplus and will be transferred to DNR in accordance with KCC 28.28.060 and Ch. 39.33 RCW.

  SECTION 2. Third Party Agreements.

The Weyerhaeuser Company has committed to accept additional amounts of biosolids on Weyerhaeuser lands for six years upon the signing of the Agreement between King County, Department of Natural Resources, and the Mountains to Sound Greenway. Weyerhaeuser's commitment will allow King County to avoid certain costs of transporting biosolids to eastern Washington.

The University of Washington, which is currently under contract with WPCD to provide independent monitoring and evaluation for biosolids applications, will extend its services under the terms of the Agreement and provide annual written reports to all parties.

## SECTION 3. Executive Authorization.

- A. To achieve the goals described above, the Council hereby authorizes the County Executive to execute and implement an Agreement with the Department of Natural Resources and the Mountains to Sound Greenway Trust, in substantially the form attached and any modifications thereto. The Agreement shall be effective from the date of signing through June 30, 2046.
- B. To implement the terms of the Agreement identified above, the County Executive is authorized to enter into related contractual agreements as follows:
- (i) An agreement to transfer to DNR at least 2400 acres of forest lands in King County now belonging, or hereafter purchased by WPCD consistent with the intent of the agreement specified in Section 2.A.
- (ii) To purchase new lands within the Greenway as defined in the Agreement using approximately \$5.9 million previously reserved for the purchase of biosolids applications lands. These lands may be transferred to DNR and designated WPCD Trust lands.
- (iii) An agreement with the University of Washington to monitor King County's biosolids application process. The agreement may be extended annually for fifty years, payment not to exceed \$25,000 annually for the first three years.

  Thereafter, the contract amount may be adjusted annually to cover additional work or inflationary costs.
- (iv) A separate agreement with the University of Washington to monitor the biosolids application process on designated Weyerhaeuser Company lands. The contract will not exceed \$30,000 annually for a six year period.
- $\hbox{ (v)} \quad \hbox{An agreement with MTS for a compost pilot program} \\$  and for a public education and outreach program pertaining to

biosolids recycling. King County will pay MTS twenty-four 1 quarterly installments of \$32,500 each for the supervision and 2 application of compost on steep slopes and logging scars within 3 the greenway, and \$25,000 annually for managing the education 4 program.
