ORDINANCE NO. **11914**

AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$10.5 million from limited tax general obligation bonds for the Arts and Natural Resources Initiative, and amending Ordinance 11578, Sections 18, 19 and 117.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$10,500,000 from unallocated bond proceeds to the arts and natural resources initiative, which includes six funding categories for arts, cultural resources and natural resource programs, as provided in Ordinance 11578 and Motion 9514.

SECTION 2. The \$10,500,000 from unallocated bond proceeds includes an appropriation of \$4,500,000 to the arts initiative 1995 sub-fund for the arts and natural resources initiative, which includes four funding categories for arts and heritage resources and science and technology centers, as provided in Ordinance No. 11578 and Motion 9514.

SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 11578, Section 18, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

CULTURAL RESOURCES DIVISION - From the Current Expense Fund, there is hereby appropriated to:

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SECTION 4. Ordinance No. 11578, Section 19, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

PARKS DIVISION - From the Current Expense Fund, there is hereby appropriated to:

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SECTION 5. Ordinance No. 11578, Section 117, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

6 PROVIDED THAT:

7 To ensure that the citizens of the region receive real economic value in
 8 consideration for the partial public funding of the construction, renovation, rehabilitation or
 9 purchase of facilities funded under the arts and natural resources initiative, arts, heritage
 10 and science organizations receiving such funds shall be obligated to provide substantial
 11 benefits to the public.

12 The public benefit policies, including specific terms and conditions as to the scope
 13 of such benefits and how such policies will be implemented and achieved, shall be further
 14 detailed in agreements with the arts, heritage or science organizations receiving support
 15 through this initiative. The public benefit obligations shall be binding for the duration of
 16 the useful life of the facilities being constructed, refurbished or purchased, or for the
 17 duration of the intended use of the fixed asset(s), a period of not less than ten years.

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PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

The initiative's six funding categories are suburban arts and heritage, major arts organizations, small arts and heritage, science and technology centers, farmland preservation and working forest program.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

It is the County Council's intent that the arts and natural resources initiative funds be distributed to major arts projects, suburban arts and heritage projects, small arts and heritage projects, science and technology centers, farmland preservation and working forest programs in compliance with goals, criteria and administrative guidelines approved and adopted by the County Council in Motion 9514.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

The County Council agrees to fund the proposed projects and related administrative expenses with councilmanic bonds, in accordance with procedures described in Motion 9514, and intends to reimburse expenditures for the initiative from future bond proceeds.

INTRODUCED AND READ for the first time this 10th day of July, 19 95.
