ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE authorizing expansion of the scope of the May Creek Trail Unincorporated King County 1989 Open Space Bond Project.

## PREAMBLE:

- The scope of the original 1989 open space bond May Creek Trail Project, which connects May Creek Park to Cougar Mountain Regional Wildland Park, has been accomplished, however, acquisition of additional property adjacent to May Creek Park is necessary to complete the trail corridor from Renton to Cougar Mountain Regional Wildland Park.
- 2. The King County Open Space Citizen Oversight Committee adopted a resolution recommending expansion of the project scope to include acquisition of property interests necessary to complete the trail corridor in May Creek Park.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted an increase in the scope of the 1989 open space bond May Creek Trail Project to include acquisition of property interests over the Sanborn and Jay parcels necessary or convenient to providing continuous trail access through May Creek Park.

INTRODUCED AND READ for this first time this 7<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1995.

PASSED by a vote of 13 to 0 this 28<sup>th</sup> day of August 1995.

King County Open Space Citizen Oversight Committee RESOLUTION NO. 95-07

A RESOLUTION recommending the King County Executive and Council to authorize expansion of the scope of the May Creek Trail 1989 Open Space Bond Project to include acquisition of a trail easement over four parcels to complete the trail connection in the May Creek Park.

WHEREAS, by Section 11 of the King County Ordinance 9071 the King County Council directed the establishment of the King County Open Space Citizen Oversight Committee ("Committee"), within one year of the passage of the Ordinance by the qualified electors of the county in the November 7, 1989 general election, and,

WHEREAS, on November 7, 1989, Ordinance 9071 was passed by greater than 60% of the qualified electors, and

WHEREAS, on April 4, 1990, the King County Council passed Motion 7886, which established the Committee to consider and address the concerns, needs and progress of all jurisdictions responsible for implementing Ordinance 9071, and to make recommendation on such other requests as transmitted to the committee from time to time by the executive or council on important matters relating to open space in King County, and

WHEREAS, the King County Open Space Section has either acquired or gained agreement for dedication all of the properties within the original project scope.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the King County Open Space Citizen Oversight Committee:

- The Committee finds that the intended purpose of the A. May Creek Trail 1989 Open Space Bond Project will best be met through the acquisition of property necessary or convenient to completing a trail over four parcels adjacent to May Creek Park to provide a trail connection that is not possible within the existing boundaries of the park.
- The Committee hereby recommends that the county council and executive authorize expansion of the scope of the May Creel

Trail 1989 Open Space Bond Project to include acquisition of a trail easement over the Sanborn and Fullenweider parcels to complete the trail connection in May Creek Park.

C. The Committee further recommends that \$35,000 from the 1989 Open Space Bond Opportunity fund be allocated by the executive for this project and that the Project be completed within one year.
