ORDINANCE NO. **11997**

AN ORDINANCE relating to and governing solicitations for charitable contribution; changing the terms of the members and the method of appointment of the employee charitable campaign committee; and amending Ordinance 8575, Section 3 as amended and K.C.C. 3.36.030.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 8575, Section 3 as amended and K.C.C. 3.36.030 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Employee Charitable Campaign Committee established.

A. Composition. A county employee charitable campaign committee is established consisting of 15 members nominated by the campaign committee appointed by the executive and confirmed by the council (~~(one county employee to be nominated by each councilmember, subject to council confirmation, and two representatives to create a balance in executive agencies to be appointed by the executive)~~).

Nominations by the Committee shall be made from a list of candidates assembled from all of the bargaining units and from unrepresented employees. The number of candidates solicited from each bargaining unit should be approximately proportional to the number of employees represented by the bargaining unit. The committee shall strive to include members representing the diversity of the county work force including at least two union members. The term of (~~(council appointed)~~) committee members shall be two years with eight members being appointed in odd-numbered years and seven

1 members being appointed in even-numbered years (~~with odd-~~
2 ~~numbered districts reappointing in odd years and even~~
3 ~~numbered districts in even years~~). Executive appointments
4 ~~shall be for two years, one in even years and one in odd~~
5 years. To ensure ((~~assure~~)) continuity of the membership for
6 each year's campaign, ((~~the~~)) terms shall begin on January 1
7 and expire March 1 two years later. The committee shall
8 elect a chair annually and such other officers as may be
9 needed.

10 B. Functions. The committee shall recommend rules
11 consistent with this chapter to the council as necessary to
12 the conduct of the charitable campaigns. The rules shall be
13 approved by the council prior to becoming effective. The
14 committee shall also coordinate the charitable campaigns.
15 Such coordination may include, but need not be limited to
16 determining which federations of charitable organizations
17 may, consistent with this chapter and any rules adopted
18 pursuant to it, participate in the county's charitable
19 campaign and the dates by which applications must be filed
20 for the annual drive. The committee shall assist the
21 executive or designee in the selection of a campaign
22 administrator who shall be responsible for the details of the
23 campaign operation under the general oversight of the
24 committee. Cost of the campaign administrator shall be
25 included as a part of the administrative cost of conducting
26 the campaign.

27 C. Compensation. Members of the committee shall serve
28 voluntarily without additional salary but shall be reimbursed
29 by their employing department for travel, lodging and meals
30 in accordance with county laws and regulations. Committee
31 members shall be given release time from regular work hours
32 to serve on the committee. Employee members of the committee

1 shall be paid no additional compensation for working beyond
2 normal working hours.

3 D. Transition. Members serving on the Committee as of
4 November 30, 1995 shall serve out their appointed term or
5 until successors are appointed consistent with this Section.
