ORDINANCE NO. 12098

AN ORDINANCE relating to public health, establishing the membership of the King County Board of Health, readopting and ratifying rules and regulations previously adopted by the Seattle Board of Health, requesting the executive to identify appropriate amendments to the interlocal agreement between King County and Seattle regarding the provision of public health services, and amending K.C.C. 1.24.040 and Ordinance 11683, Section 4, and Ordinance 11178, Section

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Findings. RCW 70.05.035 requires that the county legislative authority establish a local board of health, and provides that the legislative authority may prescribe the membership and selection process. That provision also requires that jurisdiction of the local board of health must be coextensive with the boundaries of the county: The council finds that to ensure the maximum extent of coordination of public health programs between the county and the cities within the county it is appropriate to consider a federated governing body for the board of health. The council recognizes that further discussions and analysis of the appropriate structure for public health governance will be necessary and that at least as an interim measure there is a need for immediate implementation of such a federated structure. The council further finds that it is important that the health regulations of the City of Seattle be adopted by the board on a temporary basis, pending review by the Board of Health and the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 11178, Section 2 is hereby amended
to read as follows: Board of Health: Membership. Pursuant
to Chapter 70.05.030, as amended, the ((legislative authority
of King County shall constitute)) King County Board of
Health. shall consist of the following members: ((The rules
and regulations of the board shall be adopted by ordinance.))
1. Twelve members, of the Metropolitan King County Council,
not to include the chair of the council, to be appointed by
the chair of the council;
2. Four elected officials of the city of Seattle who shall
be appointed by the city;
3. Three elected officials from suburban cities of King
County who shall be appointed in the manner agreed to by
cities representing a majority of the number of cities and of
the population in incorporated areas other than the city of
Seattle; and
4. Three health professionals, to be appointed by the other
members of the board of health. One of the health
professionals should have knowledge of environmental health,
including knowledge of septic systems and groundwater
quality. These members shall be from diverse backgrounds
such as, for example, community health clinics, traditional
medical practice, and alternative medicine or naturopathy;
5. Nothing in this measure shall be taken to reduce or limit
the budgetary authority or responsibility of the metropolitan
county council. Any program initiatives undertaken pursuant
to this measure which require funding support utilizing
county budget resources, shall be subject to the budgetary
process established by the county council.
6. Any repeal or amendment of an existing rule or regulation
which was effective prior to January 1, 1996, which applies
outside of the limits of the city of Seattle shall be adopted
only by an affirmative vote of a majority of the board as

well as an affirmative vote collectively of a majority of the King County councilmembers and the suburban city members.

SECTION 3. Continuation of Seattle Board of Health Rules and Regulations. Existing rules and regulations adopted by the Board of Health of the City of Seattle effective prior to January 1, 1996 are hereby readopted and ratified by reference herein and shall continue in full force and effect within the corporate limits of the city of Seattle until such time as they are amended or repealed by the King County Board of Health. Any such amendment or repeal shall be adopted only by an affirmative vote of the majority of the board as well as an affirmative vote of the majority of the members appointed by the city of Seattle.

SECTION 4. Ordinance 11683, Section 4, and K.C.C.
1.24.035 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Meetings. The time of regular meetings of the council shall be at nine-thirty a.m. on Monday of each week, or Tuesday if Monday is a state or county holiday, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

((The council shall convene as the Board of Health at least once per month, either during the regular council meeting, in the afternoon of the day of a regular council meeting, or during the regular committee of the whole meeting, to receive reports and testimony, and to take action on health related matters.))

SECTION 5. The county council requests the executive to identify appropriate amendments to the interlocal agreement between Seattle and King County to address policy and budget issues. Such amendments should include a recognition of the importance of the continuing partnership between the City of Seattle and King County in the provision of public health services, and an ability for the City of Seattle to exercise policy and expenditure control over its financial
