AN ORDINANCE relating to the Metropolitan King County Council, establishing rules related to its meetings, amending Ordinance 12098 Section 4 and Ordinance 11683 Section 5 and K.C.C. 1.24.035 and .045.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 12098, Section 4 and K.C.C.

1.24.035 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Rule 4: Meetings

The time of regular meetings of the council shall be at ((nine thirty a.m.))one-thirty p.m. on Monday of each week, or Tuesday if Monday is a state or county holiday, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

All sessions of the Metropolitan King County Council, except as otherwise ordered by the council, and except meetings of committees, shall be held at the county seat.

The proceedings of all council meetings shall be taken by tape recorder. The tapes of such meetings shall be retained in the office of the clerk for a period of five years, at which time the tapes shall be transferred to the division of records and elections, which will retain such tapes.
