# ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the vacation of a portion of Division Street (91st Place Southwest); Department of Transportation, Road Services Division File No. V-2188
Petitioners: Clifford and Eileen Freed, et al

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of that portion of Division Street (91st Place Southwest) abutting lots 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, and the north half of the west 50 feet of lot 5, all in block 1, Avilion Tracts, according to Volume 20 of plats, page 52, records of King County, Washington.
- 2. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements are not required.
- 3. The land use section of the department of development and environmental services has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan. However, the land use section recommends that the petitioner convey right-of-way for the Piner Point Road in exchange for the vacation area.
- 4. Property services division assessed the exchange right-of-way and established the fair market value at \$17,850. The petitioner requests King County accept the exchange right-of-way in lieu of monetary compensation.
- 5. Division Street (91st Place Southwest) is classified "C-Class". In accordance with King County Code 14.40.020, the compensation due King County is based on fifty percent of the appraised value of the adjoining lands as determined from records of the department of assessments. King County is in receipt of \$15,645.13 from the petitioner.
- 6. The department of public works found no evidence that the vacation area has ever been open as a road. A search of the records indicates no public funds have been expended for its acquisition, improvement or maintenance. The department of public works considers the subject right-of-way useless as part of the county road system and believes the public would benefit by the return of this lunused area to the public tax rolls.
- 7. The department of public works recommends King County accept the exchange right-of-way in lieu of monetary compensation with the exception of a \$200.00 administrative
- 8. The facts and conclusions set forth in the March 12, 1996, corrected revised report and recommendation to the King County council by the King County hearing examiner are incorporated herein by this reference.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and hearings by the office of the hearing examiner commenced on August 23, 1995.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition on the conditions set forth below.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY

SECTION 1: The council hereby vacates and abandons that portion of Division Street (91st Place Southwest described as follows:

That portion of Southwest Division Street adjacent to Lot 11 and adjacent to the northerly 20.05 feet of Lot 10 of Avilion Tracts Division I.

# Pre-effective conditions:

This ordinance shall become effective upon the conveyance of easements for utility purposes satisfactory to Vashon Sewer District and Dockton Water Association; and the dedication or conveyance to King County for right-of-way and utilities of a 30-foot-wide unobstructed parcel which extends from the north line of Avilion Tracts, Division I, Lot 11, to the east margin of Division Street at the south line of Lot 10, Avilion Tracts, Division I, in an alignment generally as illustrated by Exhibit No. 105 (a portion of which is attached to the hearing examiner's March 12, 1996, report) in form acceptable to the King County Department of Transportation. (NOTE: Although the alignment shown in Exhibit No. 105 is 20 feet in width, the dedication or conveyance required as a condition of this vacation is 30 feet in width.)

This ordinance shall become effective only upon the delivery and recording of the easements and dedication required by the preceding paragraph. The final date to meet these pre-effective conditions shall be December 31, 1996.
