AN ORDINANCE establishing the date of an

election on the question of annexation

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY: SECTION 1. FINDINGS OF FACT.

- A. The City of Des Moines, Washington, by Resolution No. 803 has determined that it is in the public interest, health, safety and general welfare to provide for annexation of an area known as Woodmont in accordance with Chapter 35A.14. R.C.W.
- B. Said resolution does satisfy the provisions of R.C.W. Chapter 35A.14 for qualification for annexation.
- C. The City of Des Moines, by Resolution No. 803 adopted February 1, 1996, initiated the annexation of the area known as Woodmont.
- D. Pursuant to the provisions of RCW Chapter 36.93 the Boundary Review Board (BRB) approved the proposed annexation as submitted on December 26, 1995 after no request for review was submitted.
- E. Pursuant to Chapter 29.13 and RCW 35A.14, the council deems an emergency exists for the purpose of calling a special election.

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F. The City of Des Moines forwarded its request that the proposed annexation be placed on the ballot to the council, but due to clerical error no proposed ordinance was prepared or submitted for introduction. Upon learning of this oversight, and upon consultation with the city of Des Moines, the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney, and the Record and Elections Division, the council has determined that it has an obligation to place this proposed annexation upon the May 21, 1996 election ballot. This duty can be met only by passage of this ordinance as an emergency ordinance and a joint request by the city and the county to the Superior Court to correct the error pursuant to RCW 29.04.030.

SECTION 2. A special election shall be held on the 21st day of May, 1996, in accordance with R.C.W. 35A.14.050 to be held within the territory of the proposed annexation, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters within said territory the question of annexation and assumption of a prorata portion of the existing voter-approved bonded indebtedness of the city of Des Moines, limited to such bonded indebtedness for the construction of a police station, including purchase of land and equipment as described in city of Des Moines Ordinance No. 1136. Pursuant to Motion 7393 such election shall be conducted by mail.

SECTION 3. The number of registered voters within the subject areas is estimated at 2,058 as nearly as may be determined from available records.

SECTION 4. The ballot title, as directed by statute, should be substantially as follows:

Shall the area as described in this ordinance of 2 unincorporated King County commonly known as Woodmont be 3 annexed to and be a part of the City of Des Moines and shall 4 all property within the area, upon annexation, assume a prorata portion of the existing voter-approved bonded 5 6 indebtedness of the city of Des Moines, limited to such 7 bonded indebtedness for the construction of a police station, including purchase of land and equipment as described in city 8 of Des Moines Ordinance No. 1136? 9 YES 10 NO 11 12 13 The boundaries of the territory proposed for SECTION 5. annexation are hereby described as follows: 14 15 Thence leaving the city limits line of the City of Kent as annexed by Ordinance No. 1002 and going southerly along said 16 17 westerly margin of Pacific Highway South (Seattle-Tacoma Road) (State Road No. 1) (US 99) to its intersection with the 18 19 south margin of South 272nd Street; 2.0 Thence westerly along said south margin to the easterly 21 margin of Marine View Drive South (12th Place South) as 22 vacated by King County Ordinance No. 3429, on September 26, 1977; 23 2.4 Thence southwest along said margin as vacated to the point of intersection with the westerly extension of the south line of 25 26 the north half of Government Lot 1, Section 32, Township 22 27 North, Range 4 East of the Willamette Meridian; 2.8 Thence easterly along said south line to the east line of the 29 west half of the northeast quarter of said Section 32; 3.0 Thence southerly along said east line of the west half of the 31 northeast quarter and the east line of the west half of the southeast quarter of said section to the south line thereof, 32 said point also being on the city limits line of the City of 33 34 Federal Way as incorporation by Ordinance No. 8779; 35 Thence along said city limits line of the City of Federal Way 36 the following courses: 37 Westerly along said south line of said section to the west margin of Redondo Way South; 38 Thence northerly along said margin to the northeast corner of 39 Tract A of the plat of Marine Hills East as recorded in 40 41 Volume 97 of plats at Pages 76-77, records of King County,

Washington;

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1 2 3	Thence westerly along the north line of said Tract A to the northwest corner thereof, also being the southeast corner of Lot 63 of said plat;
4 5 6 7 8 9	Thence northerly, westerly, southerly, and northwesterly along the boundary of said plat to the northern most point of Lot 76 of said plat, said point also being the eastern most corner of Lot 6 on the plat of Marine Hills No. 17, as recorded in Volume 98 of plats at Pages 50-52, records of King County;
10 11	Thence northwesterly to the most northern point on Lot 6 of said plat;
12 13 14 15 16	Thence southwesterly, southeasterly, and west along the northwesterly boundary of said plat to the northwest corner of Lot 24 of said plat, said northwest corner being on the north line of Government Lot 4 in Section 5, Township 21 north, Range 4 East of the Willamette Meridian;
17 18 19 20	Thence west along the north line of said Government Lot 4 to the westerly line of the plat of Marine Hills West as recorded in Volume 98, at Pages 53-55, records of King County, Washington;
21 22 23	Thence southwesterly and southeasterly along the westerly line of said plat to its intersection with the east line of said Government Lot 4;
24	SECTION 6. The notice of election shall be published as
25	required by law.

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SECTION 7. The Council hereby finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health or safety or for the support of county government and its existing public institutions.
