ORDINANCE NO. 12248

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AN ORDINANCE approving the City of
Enumclaw 1993 Comprehensive Water System
Plan.

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PREAMBLE:

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K.C.C. 13.24 requires approval of
comprehensive plans for water purveyors
as a prerequisite to the granting of
right-of-way franchises and approval of
right-of-way construction permits.

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On November 29, 1995 the King County
Utilities Technical Review Committee met
to consider the plan and finding it
consistent with K.C.C. 13.24, recommended
approval.

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The City of Enumclaw 1993 Comprehensive
Water System Plan was approved by the
Enumclaw City Council on June 13, 1994.

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The City of Enumclaw issued a
Determination of Nonsignificance for the
plan in accordance with the State
Environmental Policy Act on May 20, 1994.

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

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SECTION 1. The City of Enumclaw 1993 Comprehensive

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Water System Plan, Attachment A, is hereby approved, subject

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to the condition that Enumclaw shall not use farmland
