ORDINANCE NO. 12370

AN ORDINANCE revising the process for considering citizen-initiated road closure requests; amending Ordinance No. 10962 and K.C.C. 14.38.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 10962, Section 1 and K.C.C. 14.38.010 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Authority. The department of ((public works)) transportation shall be responsible for receiving and processing all road closure petitions, and for ((determining)) recommending to the council whether or not the roads identified in the petition ((shall)) should be closed. The authority make issue said ((determinations)) to and recommendations shall be vested in the director, department of ((public works)) transportation. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to abrogate or abridge the powers of the county road engineer to temporarily ((or permanently)) close county roads, as may be authorized by law.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 10962, Section 2 and K.C.C. 14.38.020 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Petitions. A. Petitions to close King County roads shall be filed with the director, department of ((public works)) transportation.

B. Said petitions shall include: the names, signatures and legal addresses of the persons filing the petition; the location of the roads or streets which the petitioners wish to have closed, including the intersections delineating the boundaries of the road or street sections to be closed; a map depicting the road or streets sections requested to be closed; and the reasons for petitioning for closure of the street or road. Other information or documents as the petitioners deem pertinent may be included. Petitions for road closures shall

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include the names and signatures of at least a simple majority of the owners of property residing along the sections(s) of road being petitioned for closure and the signatures of at least ten percent of the owners of property being served by arterial roads and neighborhood collector streets to which traffic would be diverted within a distance of 660 feet from the road section petitioned for closure.

- C. Reasons for petitioning the county for the closure of a road shall be limited to safety hazards posed pedestrians, contiguous real property, and/or traffic such as, but not limited to, traffic speeds, volume, or types of vehicle using the road or street, the adequacy of road signage, and road design considerations.
- D. Petitioners shall submit whatever quantitative other analyses they may possess in support of their petition, such as traffic volumes or counts, or numbers of accidents which have occurred on the road or street petitioned to be closed.
- E. The director may consider a request for road closure which is not in conformance with the petition provisions of this chapter from any person. The decision of the director on such a request shall not be subject to the provisions of Section((s)) .030((and .050)).

SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 10962, Section 3 and K.C.C. 14.38.030 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Determination. A. The director, department of ((public shall do the following upon the works)) transportation, receipt of a petition for road closure:

- 1. Acknowledge in writing within ten calendar days the receipt of the petition.
- 2. Refer the petition to the county road engineer for determination, and for the making investigation, recommendation on road closure to the director.
- B. The county road engineer's recommendation shall be submitted to the director in writing no later than sixty days after the receipt of the petition.
- C. The director shall notify the petitioners in writing of his ((decision)) recommendation within ten days of the receipt of the county road engineer's recommendation on the road closure petition. Said notification shall delineate the

 process for ((appealing a denial)) council consideration of the director's recommendation on a petition to close a county road.

- D. The director may ((reject)) oppose the petition for road closure or may determine that the portion of the road specified in the petition ((is to)) should be fully closed, closed to through traffic only, open to emergency vehicles only, closed in one direction only, closed to certain types of vehicles or temporarily closed in one of the ways specified.
- E. In addition to making a determination on the merits of the road closure petition, the director may also identify safety measures for the area defined by the road closure petition as an alternative to road closure and may implement those road safety-related mitigations.
- F. The ((decision)) recommendation of the director to close a county road shall be forwarded to the council for consideration and adoption by ordinance ((,unless an appeal of the director's decision is filed pursuant to the requirements of Section .040)).
- G. The recommendation of the director to reject a petition to close county road shall be conveyed by letter to the council which reserves the option, following such notification, of closing all or a portion of the road that is the subject of the petition.
