ORDINANCE NO.

3 NEW SECTION. SECTION 4. There is hereby added to K.C.C. 17.04 a new
4 section which amends Uniform Fire Code Section 1603, as amended by WAC 51-34-
5 6103, to read as follows:

6 UFC 6103. Permits. See Section 105.8 for permits. A permit is required to
7 remove, abandon, place temporarily out of service or otherwise dispose of a
8 combustible liquids tank. Such a permit may be issued without an inspection of the
9 tank or premises as otherwise required in Section 105.4.
