MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

(Re: Security Assistants)

WHEREAS, the Teamsters, Local 763 and King County are parties to a collective bargaining agreement covering security assistants in the Department of Public Safety; and

WHEREAS, a weekend court calendar at the Regional Justice Center (RJC) has required security work be provided at the RJC on the weekend; and

WHEREAS, the weekend work at the RJC ("the Work"), as currently configured, can be performed by the security assistants; and

WHEREAS, the security assistants are not always available to perform the Work. In these instances, the Department may need to assign the Work to employees outside the bargaining unit.

THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Prior to assigning the Work outside the bargaining unit, the Department will make reasonable efforts to first offer the work to members of the bargaining unit.
- 2. If, after reasonable efforts to offer the Work to bargaining unit members, the Department is still unable to meet its staffing needs for the Work, the Department may offer the Work to non-bargaining unit members, including but not limited to members of the King County Police Officer's Guild.
- 3. Nothing in this Agreement shall restrict the Department's ability to assign the Work to bargaining unit employees.
