AN ORDINANCE authorizing the vacation of a portion of Robinwood Road Southwest (V-2295). Petitioners: Donald N. Davis and Robert and Gertrude F. Rempfer.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has filed requesting vacation of that portion of Robinwood Road Southwest hereinafter described.
- 2. The department of transportation has received comments and recommendations regarding the proposed road vacation from various agencies. The utility companies serving the area have been notified, and staff was advised that Puget Sound Energy and TCI Auburn Cable Company have secured easements over the proposed vacation area. No other utility easements were required.
- 3. The department of transportation found evidence that portions of the right-of way in the area are open and utilized as a public road. A review of the records indicates that public funds have been expended for its maintenance. The department of transportation believes that the public would benefit by the return of this area to the public tax rolls subject to an emergency access easement across the vacation area.
