ORDINANCE NO. 13037

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Public Safety, amending the identification of the Department of Public Safety to include the name "Sheriff", and amending Ordinance 1438, Section 3(c) and K.C.C. 2.16.060, and amending Ordinance 1492, Section 20 and K.C.C. 6.24.150, and amending Ordinance 12003, Section 19, Ordinance 11684, Section 15, Ordinance 6798, Section 70 and K.C.C. 7.12.700, and amending Ordinance 1069, Section 1 and K.C.C. 12.08.010.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1: Ordinance 1438, Section 3(c) and K.C.C. 2.16.060 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

A. The department of public safety, as identified in the King County Charter Section 3.50.20.40, and managed by the King County Sheriff, may also be known and cited in the King County Code and in other usage as the office of the sheriff. Employees managed by the King County Sheriff may be referred to in the King County Code or otherwise, as King County police, King County officer, or deputy sheriff.

A. B. The department of public safety is responsible to keep and preserve the public peace and safety including the discharge of all duties of the office of sheriff under State law, except those duties relating to jails and inmates which are performed by other departments of county government. The functions of the department include:

- 1. Oversee a crime prevention program, investigate crimes against persons and property and arrest alleged offenders.
- 2. Execute the processes and orders of the courts of justice and all other mandated functions required by law.
- 3. In coordination with the office of emergency management, plan and coordinate resources for the public safety and welfare in the event of a major emergency or disaster.
- 4. Provide service and administrative functions which support but do not duplicate other governmental activities, and which have the potential to be fiscally self-supportive.
- B. C. The department of public safety shall be composed of the following divisions:
- 1. Field operations division. The division of field operations shall be responsible for administering resources allocated to the functions of police patrol, general criminal investigation, crime prevention, traffic, and emergency management.
- 2. Technical services division. The division of technical services shall be responsible for administering resources allocated to the functions of:
 - a. Civil process;
 - b. Fiscal control;
 - c. Communications;
 - d. Personnel and training;
 - e. Records and identification; and
- f. Property management, including evidence; stolen, lost or unclaimed property; and department equipment and supplies.

3. Criminal investigation division. The division of criminal investigation shall be responsible for administering resources allocated to the functions of major crimes investigation, narcotics investigation, gambling and vice investigation, criminal warrants service, and sundry criminal investigations not conducted in the field operations division.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 1492, Section 20 and K.C.C. 6.24.150 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

Certain practices prohibited. A. It is unlawful for a licensee to represent to members of the public in any way, either directly or indirectly or by implication, that the licensee is an official or semiofficial law enforcement organization or that employees, agents or solicitors of the licensee are authorized by the state of Washington or any of its political subdivisions to act as law enforcement officers, including, by way of example but not limitation, the following conduct:

- 1. Use of any name or initials in the course of business which has the capacity or tendency to convey said representation to members of the consuming public, including, but not limited to, any name using the words "police((,))", "department((,))", "King County Police((,))", ((ex)) "King County Detective((,))", "King County Sheriff" or "King County Deputy Sheriff";
- 2. Use of any uniform, badge, insignia, business card, stationery or any other device, object((,)) or type of apparel, which is not readily distinguishable to average members of the consuming public from such devices, objects((,)) or types of apparel which are used by authorized law enforcement officers;
- 3. Use any uniform badge, insignia, title((,)) or identification card, or make any statement with the intent to give an impression that the licensee is connected in any way

with the federal government, a state government((,)) or any political subdivision of either; or

4. Use any letterhead, advertisement((,)) or other printed matter, or in any manner illegally represents that the licensee is an instrumentality of the federal government, state government((,)) or any political subdivision of either.

B. It is unlawful for any licensee to engage in any acts, practices((,)) or conduct which hampers the operations and activities of authorized law enforcement and public safety officials.

SECTION 3. Ordinance 6798, Section 70 and K.C.C. 7.12.700 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

Enforcement methods. Violation of the park rules may be a civil infraction or criminal misdemeanor. The initial method of enforcement shall be by a request for voluntary compliance. Violation of the ((K.C.C.)) King County code may be subject to enforcement by the King County ((Police)) sheriff pursuant to K.C.C. 7.12.650 and 7.12.660. In addition, any person failing to comply with the park rules shall be subject to the loss of park or recreation facility use privileges and ejection from county park areas or associated marine park areas. In the future, at the direction of the department director, the park rules ordinance may be updated to request that certain department personnel be commissioned by the ((director of the department of public safety)) King County sheriff for the purpose of issuing citations to the violators of adopted park rules.

SECTION 4. Ordinance 1069, Section 1, and K.C.C. 12.08.010 are hereby amended to read as follows:

. Impersonating members of the public safety department. It is unlawful for anyone:

A. To represent himself falsely to be a member of the department of public safety, hereinafter referred to as "the department" or a special member appointed pursuant to RCW 36.28.020;

B. To wear without authority of the ((department's director)) King County sheriff uniforms or a distinctive part thereof, or any badge or insignia of the department of public safety, or any facsimile of the aforementioned uniform, badge((,)) or insignia;

C. To wear or carry upon his person or display upon a vehicle without the authority 1 2 of the ((department's director)) King County sheriff any object, device or lettering containing the words "King County Police Officer", "King County Deputy Sheriff", "King 3 County Detective", "King County Patrol", ((ex)) "King County Police" or any such words 4 5 of a similar nature reasonably designed to create the impression such person is in any manner connected with the department. 6 7 February, 1997.
