Memorandum of Understanding Between the **Joint Crafts Council And King County**

- 1. This Memorandum memorializes an Agreement modifying the Collective Bargaining Agreement dated January 1, 1996 (hereinafter "Agreement") between King County ("County") and the Joint Crafts Council, ("Council"), and its constituent unions. This modification is incorporated into that Agreement and shall be enforced in a manner consistent with that Agreement.
- 11. The Parties agree that a Footwear Allowance is appropriate to effectuate safety in the workplace.
- III. Effective upon the first full pay period after adoption of this agreement as an ordinance by the Metropolitan King County Council, the County shall pay up to seventy five dollars (\$75.00) per contract (referring to the Agreement) year to eligible employees.
- IV. An eligible employee is a full time regular employee (as those terms are defined in the King County Code, Section 3.12.010), regularly assigned to the Solid Waste Division of the Department of Natural Resources whose regular duties require, pursuant to WAC 296-24-088 Occupational Foot Protection, protective or other specialized footwear (specifically, Equipment Operators, Machinist, Garage Service, and Welder personnel).
- V. Requests for reimbursement shall be accompanied by a receipt evidencing repair or replacement of footwear complying with WAC 296-24-088. Such requests shall be submitted to the employee's immediate supervisor or such person as the Manager of the Solid Waste Division shall designate.
- VI. An employee whose requests for reimbursement in one calendar year do not exhaust the seventy five dollar (\$75.00) allowance, may carry the remainder over into the next calendar year. Reimbursement shall be on a FIFO basis such that the allowed requests for reimbursement shall first be paid from any "carried over" remainder and then from the current year's allowance.

VII. Either party may terminate this agreement upon thirty days notice.
