AN ORDINANCE creating the wastewater equipment, rental and revolving fund, amending Ordinance 12076, Section 9, and K.C.C. 4.08.015, as amended, and Ordinance 12925, Sections 1 through 7, and K.C.C. 4.08.305.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 12076, Section 9, and K.C.C. 4.08.015, each as amended, are each hereby amended to read as follows:

#### B. The following shall also be first tier funds:

- 1. All funds now or hereafter established by ordinance for capital construction through specific road improvement districts, utility local improvement districts or local improvement districts. The director of the department of transportation shall be the fund manager for transportation-related funds. The director of the department of natural resources shall be the fund manager for utility-related funds.
- 2. All county funds that receive original proceeds of borrowings made pursuant to Chapter 216, Washington Laws of 1982, as now existing or hereafter amended, to the extent of the amounts then outstanding for such borrowings for that fund. For purposes of this subsection, the director of the county department or office primarily responsible for expenditures from that fund shall be the fund manager.
- 3. Any other fund as the council may hereinafter prescribe by ordinance to be invested for its own benefit. If no designation is made by the council upon creation of the county fund, then the fund shall be treated as provided in K.C.C. 4.10.110.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 12925, Sections 1 through 7, and K.C.C. 4.08.305 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

A. There is hereby created the ((\(\W)\)\wastewater ((\(\Frac{\text{Fleet Replacement}}{\text{Replacement}}\)) equipment, rental and revolving ((\(\Frac{\text{F}}{\text{F}}\))\frac{\text{fund}}{\text{(used)}}\), classified as ((a revolving)) an internal service fund, for the ((sole)) purpose of ((accumulating)) accounting for financial resources for the ((replacement,)) full costing of rolling stock ((utilized by the wastewater treatment division of the department of natural resources)) purchased by the water quality fund. For the purposes of this section, "full costing" means all costs associated with operation, maintenance, rental, repair, replacement, central service cost allocation and department and division overhead.

((The Wastewater Fleet Replacement Fund shall be a first tier fund as described in K.C.C. 4.08 and shall be classified as a Capital Improvement Fund.))

B.Ownership of the equipment to be replaced by the ((\overline{\Psi})\overline{\Psi} astewater ((\overline{\Fleet} \)

Replacement)) equipment, rental and revolving ((\overline{\Fleet}})\overline{\Fleet} fund is hereby transferred to that fund.

Such equipment shall be reserved for the use and benefit of the wastewater treatment division and those parts of the water and land resources division that are funded through sewer rates.

C.The department of transportation shall be the fund manager((. The fleet administration division)), shall ((acquire, maintain and)) establish ((replacement schedules and replacement)) charges to recover full costing for the equipment owned by the ((\overline{\psi})) wastewater ((Fleet Replacement)) equipment, rental and revolving ((F)) fund and shall establish the terms and charges for sale of surplus equipment.

D. Annual appropriations of sewer rate revenues, beginning in 1998, shall be included in the wastewater treatment operating budget for transfer to the ((\(\frac{W}\))\(\frac{w}{a}\) stewater ((\(\frac{Fleet}{Replacement}\)) equipment, rental and revolving ((\(\frac{F}\)))\(\frac{f}{a}\) und. This annual appropriation shall be based upon the ((\(\frac{replacement}{replacement}\)) charges for full costing as determined by the department of transportation to be sufficient ((\(\frac{t}{a}\))\(\frac{m}{a}\) into the ((\(\frac{W}{a}\))\(\frac{w}{a}\)) for full costing. Transfers ((\(\frac{f}{a}\))\(\frac{f}{a}\) from the ((\(\frac{W}{a}\))\(\frac{w}{a}\) are ((\(\frac{Q}{a}\))\(\frac{d}{a}\) into the ((\(\frac{W}{a}\))\(\frac{w}{a}\) stewater ((\(\frac{F}{a}\))\(\frac{d}{a}\)) equipment, rental and revolving ((\(\frac{F}{a}\))\(\frac{f}{a}\)) fund shall be made monthly, consistent with RCW 36.33A.050, and shall be credited as ((\(\frac{i}{a}\))\(\frac{f}{a}\)) revenues to the wastewater equipment, rental and revolving ((\(\frac{F}{a}\)))\(\frac{f}{a}\)) fund.

E. Uses of the ((\overline{W}))wastewater ((Fleet Replacement)) equipment, rental and revolving ((F))fund shall be limited to ((replacement of existing equipment)) full costing associated with management of the fleet.

F. All earnings from the investment of funds accumulated in the ((W)) wastewater 1 ((Fleet Replacement)) equipment, rental and revolving ((F)) fund shall be deposited and 2 credited to the ((\Psi)) wastewater ((Fleet Replacement)) equipment, rental and revolving 3 4 ((£)) fund. Revenue from the sale of surplus equipment originally purchased by the 5 ((W)) water ((Q)) quality ((F)) fund((W)) which will be replaced by and transferred to the ((W))wastewater ((Fleet Replacement)) equipment, rental and revolving ((F))fund, shall be 6 deposited and credited to the ((\(\frac{\pi}{\pi}\))) wastewater ((\(\frac{\text{Fleet Replacement}}{\text{Replacement}}\)) equipment, rental and 7 8 revolving ((\varphi)) fund, beginning in 1998.
