On August 24, 1993 the Washington State department of transportation executed a quit claim to King County and recorded under recording number 9308241343. The quit claim deed relinquished the state's interest in State Highway No. 5. A review of the records indicates that public funds have been expended for its acquisition, improvement and maintenance. The King County department of transportation considers the subject right-of-way unnecessary as part of the county road system and believes that the public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.
