ORDINANCE NO. **13333**

AN ORDINANCE adopting fee schedules for the work, education and release program, jail health services medical services copayments, special detention facility twenty-four and forty-eight-hour commitments, to comply with Ordinance 12715, Section 1; amending Ordinance 12917, Section 1, and K.C.C. 2.73.050.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. A. Section 2 of this ordinance proposes changes in the fees currently charged for work and education release and electronic home detention.

B. These fees are assessed pursuant to K.C.C. 2.99.030.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 12917, Section 1, and K.C.C. 2.73.050 are hereby amended as follows:

Work((,)) education ((and)) release and electronic home detention fees. A.

Program participants engaged in job search pay (\$7.50) seven dollars fifty cents per day, except for in-custody community corrections program eligible inmates who pay (\$4.00) four dollars per day for the first two weeks, then (\$7.50) seven dollars fifty cents per day thereafter. Inmates who were previously employed, became unemployed

1 while on the program((,)) and are placed in a job search category pay ((~~\$7.50~~) seven
2 dollars fifty cents per day.

3 2. Program participants enrolled in educational programs pay ((~~\$3.00~~) three
4 dollars per day for high school and GED programs((,)) and ((~~\$8.00~~) eight dollars per day
5 while enrolled in college classes, trade or technical schools.

6 3. Program participants who receive outside treatment pay ((~~\$7.00~~) seven dollars
7 per day.

8 4. Out-of-((C))county program participants shall be charged the same daily rate as
9 charged to contracting agencies.

10 5. Should the net maintenance fee be lower than the daily room and board rate the
11 net maintenance fee shall be the amount charged.

12 B. Jail ((H))health ((S))services. Incarcerated individuals pay a ((~~\$5.00~~) five-dollar
13 co((-))payment for medical care when they are seen by a nurse or dental staff in response to
14 a request for medical or dental services. The fee-for-service program is based upon the
15 principle that access to health care will be available to all inmates regardless of their ability
16 to pay.

17 C. Special ((D))detention ((F))facility ((24)) twenty-four- and ((48)) forty-eight-hour
18 commitments. The following fee schedule shall apply for special detention facility ((24))
19 twenty-four- and ((48)) forty-eight-hour commitments:

20 A person who is housed at the ((N))north ((R))rehabilitation ((F))facility pursuant to a
21 court-ordered ((24)) twenty-four-to-((48)) forty-eight-hour commitment upon a conviction
22 of violating RCW 46.61.502 or SMC 11.56.02000 or upon a conviction of violating RCW
23 46.61.504 or SMC 11.56.02008, shall pay a daily housing fee. ((according to the following

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1 guidelines with the lowest allowable payment set at 125% of the federal poverty
 2 guidelines adjusted for number of persons in household:

 4 The daily housing fee for each twenty-four hours of commitment shall be the net
 5 maintenance fee, adjusted according to the following sliding scale based on the United
 6 States Community Services Administration (CSA) Poverty Guidelines, as adjusted for
 7 family size.

1 D. "Net maintenance fee" shall mean the fee that is calculated and established annually
2 by the department of adult detention according to the formula contained in contract for jail
3 services between the county and the cities in King County. The department shall promptly
4 file a statement of the fee with the clerk of the council.

5 SECTION 3. This ordinance takes effect January 1, 1999.
