AN ORDINANCE approving the King County Water District No. 20 Amendment Number 1 to the 1994 Comprehensive Water System Plan Update.

PREAMBLE:

K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires approval of comprehensive plans for water utilities as a prerequisite for granting right-of-way franchises and approval of right-of-way construction permits.

The King County Water District No. 20 Amendment Number 1 to the 1994 Comprehensive Water System Plan Update ("amendment") discusses changes to the King County water district 20 ("district") service area and capital improvement program. The changes in service area are due to proposed construction of the third runway at the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport. The construction will preclude an adjacent water district, King County water district 125, from serving all of its current service area. The proposed capital improvement program reflects extension of water service to the new service area and continued replacement of undersized water mains in the rest of the district.

The King County utilities technical review committee (UTRC) reviewed and conditionally approved the amendment on May 12, 1999. The conditions of UTRC approval, technical changes to the amendment, have been met and are reflected in the final version attached to this ordinance.

The district prepared a determination of nonsignificance for the amendment on September 24, 1999, in accordance with the state Environmental Policy Act.

The district adopted the amendment on March 2, 1999.

The UTRC recommends that the council approve the amendment.

AMENDMENT NUMBER 1

TO THE 1994 COMPREHENSIVE WATER SYSTEM PLAN

A. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Amendment Number 1 to the 1994 Comprehensive Water System Plan for King County Water District No. 20 is to update the plan in response to two current and ongoing elements. These are:

- 1. Proposed extension of the District Capital Improvement Plan by development of an additional four-year series of water main replacement projects.
- 2. Proposed change in the District's service boundary due to construction of the Port of Seattle SeaTac International Airport Third Runway.

B. BACKGROUND

In 1994, King County Water District No. 20 prepared its 1994 Comprehensive Water System Plan Update. Approval by the State of Washington Department of Health was received on June 6, 1996, in accordance with WAC 246-290.

Since approval of the Water System Plan, two events have necessitated a revision or amendment to the Plan:

1. Expanded Capital Improvement Program

Chapter 4 of the Plan established a six-year program for replacement of old and undersized water mains throughout the District for the years 1995 through 2000. Because of favorable construction bids, with the completion of the 1998 CIP now under construction, the majority of the projects shown in the original plan will be completed.

This amendment develops an additional four-year program to complete the replacement of the old 4-inch water mains and establishes yearly projects for years 2000 through 2003.

2. Expanded Water Service Area

Construction of the SeaTac International Airport's Third Runway requires purchase of properties adjacent to the airport and abandonment of the related water systems in these areas. Water Districts directly affected are King County Water District Nos. 20, 49 and 125.

The expansion of the airport involves the relocation and reconstruction of South 154th Street/South 156th Way. This street at the north end of the airport complex is in both Water District No. 20 and No. 125.

Because of the abandonment of portions of the water system, Water District 125 is unable to serve the area along South 154th Street/South 156th Way within its corporate boundary. To provide water service for fire protection along the street and for the street-related irrigation systems, connection to Water District No. 20's system and installation of a 12-inch main is proposed as part of the airport expansion. Water District 20 will therefore be providing water service to a portion of Water District 125's current area as a result of this new main.

C. LIST OF EXHIBITS

Exhibits A1 through A5 show the four-year extension to the Capital Facilities Plan as follows:

All pipes are expected to be 8" diameter ductile iron water mains.

Exhibit C shows the extent of the new main along South 154th Street/South 156th Way. Limits of the installation are generally between Des Moines Memorial Drive in Water District 20 to 24th Avenue South in Water District 125. The common District boundary is at approximately 11th Avenue South in this area.

D. PROJECT COSTS

Installation of the proposed 12" water main along South 154th Street/South 156th Way is part of the airport expansion and does not require any District funds. Project design and management is being done through the Developer Extension process.

Estimated project costs for the proposed Four Year Program are as follows:

Four Year Total Cost	\$3,468,300

Construction of the proposed Four-Year Program will complete replacement of the remaining 4-inch and smaller water mains.

Replacements shown in the year 2003 project may be adjusted or deleted because of additional water system abandonment due to the airport expansion. Additional possible property acquisition by the Port of Seattle for the expansion of the airport, related buffer areas and the third runway will allow abandonment of the old 4-inch system prior to any replacement and upgrade of the water system.


