20	(3) approximately six million gallons of additional storage at North Creek to be
21	developed by 2002 to provide early overflow protection for the north end.
22	C. Financial analysis indicates that the rate impact of the newly adopted plan on
23	the monthly sewer rates over the thirty year planning period, not adjusted for inflation, is
24	\$0.12 more than the adopted 2000 monthly sewer rate of \$19.50.
25	D. The council intends the \$19.75 per residential customer equivalent per month
26	sewer rate to provide sufficient funds for operations and capital development of the
27	wastewater program through the end of fiscal year 2003. This rate will facilitate the
28	implementation of the newly adopted RWSP.
29	SECTION 2. Monetary requirements for the disposal of sewage; establishment
30	of the sewer rate for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2001 and ending December
31	31, 2001. The council hereby determines the monetary requirements for the disposal of
32	sewage as follows:
33	Administration, operating, maintenance repair and replace (net of other income):
34	\$64,461,000.
35	Establishment and maintenance of necessary working capital reserves: \$371,260.
36	Requirements of revenue bond resolutions (not included in above items and net of interest
3,7	income): \$101,063,000.
38	TOTAL: \$165,895,260.

40	Having determined the monetary requirements for the disposal of sewage, the council als
41	hereby adopts a 2001 sewer rate of \$19.75 per residential customer equivalent per month
42	Prior to July 1, 2000, a copy of this ordinance shall be delivered to each agency having an
43	agreement for sewage disposal with King County.
