1 AN ORDINANCE establishing the 2000 work plan for the
2 regional water quality committee of the King County

6 **PREAMBLE:**

7 The regional water quality committee of the King County council is
8 established by the King County Charter and may develop, recommend and
9 review regional policies and plans for consideration by the metropolitan
10 county council. This ordinance describes the 2000 work plan for the
11 regional water quality committee.

12 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:**

13 **SECTION 1.** The work plan for the regional water quality committee for 2000
14 shall address countywide policies, plans or topics listed in Attachment A.

15 **SECTION 2.** In addition to the items listed in section 1 of this ordinance, the
16 work plan shall include countywide policies or plans that respond to current or emergent
17 concerns, that are of regional interest and that relate to multiple jurisdictions.

18 The committee may amend its work plan to include such issues, for consideration by the
19 council.




