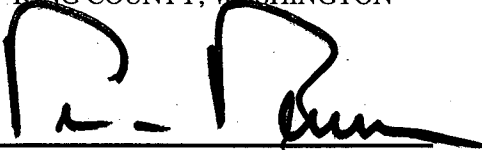

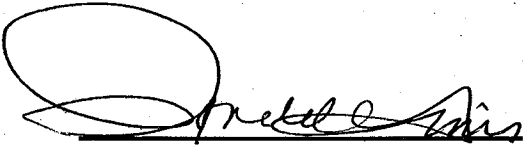

The Buildable Lands project has been underway since last year. This grant is a continuation of that effort and will enable King County and its cities to develop, analyze and report on growth trends in compliance with RCW 36.70A.215. King County will distribute \$134,234 to suburban cities, \$67,117 to the City of Seattle and retain \$67,116 to implement the program.
