1 AN ORDINANCE making supplemental appropriations of  
2 \$4,603,993 to the work training program from the Seattle-  
3 King County Workforce Development Council and  
4 \$160,000 to the building repair and replacement subfund to  
5 continue funding for the courthouse seismic project office  
6 and county space and facilities peer review panel; and  
7 amending the 2000 Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 13678,  
8 Sections 89 and 121, and Ordinance 13678, attachment 3,  
9 as amended.

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12 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

13 SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted a supplemental appropriation  
14 of \$4,603,993 to the work training program from the Seattle-King County Workforce  
15 Development Council to implement the dislocated worker program. There is hereby  
16 approved and adopted a supplemental appropriation of \$160,000 to the building repair and  
17 replacement subfund 3951 for the purpose of continuing the operation of the courthouse  
18 seismic project office and funding the county space and facilities peer review panel.

19            SECTION 2. Ordinance 13678, Section 89, as amended, is hereby amended by  
20 adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

21            YOUTH EMPLOYMENT – From the work training program fund there is hereby  
22 appropriated to:

23	Youth employment	\$4,603,993
24	The number of additional FTEs for youth employment shall be	47.0

25            SECTION 3. Ordinance 13678, Section 121, is hereby amended by adding thereto  
26 and inserting the following:

27            From the several capital improvement project funds there are hereby appropriated and  
28 authorized to be disbursed the following:

29	<u>FUND</u>	<u>CAPITAL FUND NAME</u>	<u>AMOUNT</u>
30	3951	Building repair and replacement subfund	\$160,000

31            PROVIDED FURTHER THAT

32            The cost of the council's King county space and facilities peer review panel as  
33 managed by the council shall be paid from the CIP project number 395716, courthouse  
34 seismic project, and is not to exceed \$50,000. Of the remaining amount appropriate, \$80,000  
35 is intended to fund the courthouse seismic project office; and \$30,000 is to fund the cost of  
36 employing consultants for the council's review of major capital projects such as the  
37 courthouse.

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SECTION 4. Ordinance 12678, Attachment 3, is hereby amended by adding  
thereto and inserting therein the following:



Re: Dislocated Worker Program

Dear Executive Sims:

At the March 10, 2000 meeting of the Workforce Development Council (WDC), the Council confirmed that WDC would sole source contract the current Dislocated Worker Program to the King County Work Training Program (KCWTP). In this regard, this letter is being written to acknowledge this action and to authorize the King County Work Training Program to operate the countywide Dislocated Worker Program and manage the Renton WorkSource facility. This sole source contract is for an initial three-year period beginning on July 1, 2000 and ending on June 30, 2003 and is renewable for up to two more years at the discretion of the Council. Funding for this contract will be a maximum of \$13,765,692 for the three-year period with the first-year contract amount not to exceed \$8,500,000.

This letter is effective for the period of July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001 unless amended or superseded by a fully executed contract.

The Contractor (King County Work Training Program) shall provide:

- Such reports as required by the WDC to finalize the contract by June 1, 2000.
- Completed budget package based on the total Dislocated Worker Program by cost category.
- Revised program narrative to reflect WDC strategic initiatives, if necessary.

A complete contract package, containing the necessary forms, will be forwarded to you no later than May 1, 2000. All terms and conditions specified in the executed contract shall supercede those in this letter.
