| 15 | BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY: |
| 16 | |
| 17 | SECTION 1. Findings; Authorization of Capital Improvements. |

| A. The county council hereby finds the following facts. The county has made |
|---|
| significant efforts to determine whether existing county facilities comply with seismic |
| standards and to make improvements to those facilities that do not comply with seismic |
| standards. Harborview Medical Center, including facilities used by the Medical |
| Examiner's Office, is among the county's most essential public health and safety |
| facilities that fail to meet seismic standards. |

B. Harborview Medical Center is the only designated level one trauma center in a four-state region providing emergency patient care. Because Harborview plays a key role in emergency services and disaster planning in King County, the county wishes to undertake a seismic retrofit of its facilities to achieve the appropriate standards of seismic stability for such facilities as established by the Federal Emergency Management Administration and to make related public health and safety improvements to meet the region's critical health care needs. Because the King County Medical Examiner plays a key role in investigating and prosecuting violent crimes in King County, the county also wishes to undertake improvements to the inadequate facilities currently housing the Medical Examiner's Office.

C. The county's plan for seismic and public health and safety improvements to facilities of Harborview Medical Center is designed to assure uninterrupted trauma care and other emergency operations. The plan requires the demolition of seismically unsound buildings, the construction of new buildings to house services displaced from the demolished buildings, and expansion and renovation of existing facilities to provide seismic stability for those and adjacent facilities and to provide additional critical health care capacity. Inpatient and outpatient clinical services and the public health services

provided by the county's Medical Examiner's Office are among the services that will be displaced from the demolished buildings.

D. To provide financing for the seismic and health and public safety improvements for Harborview Medical Center authorized by this ordinance, it is deemed necessary and advisable that the county issue and sell its unlimited tax general obligation bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed \$193,130,000. The constitution and laws of the State of Washington provide that the question of whether or not the county may issue such bonds be submitted to the qualified electors of the county for their ratification or rejection.

E. King County Proposition No. 1 was submitted to the qualified electors of King County at the September 19, 2000 election, but as of the date of enactment of this ordinance it is unknown whether the measure has been approved or rejected. To enable the voters to consider this measure at the November 7, 2000 general election it is necessary to submit an enacted measure to the Superintendent of Elections no later than September 22, 2000. To meet this legal deadline it is necessary that this measure be enacted as an emergency ordinance. Submitting to the voters this proposition for authorization of funding for seismic and health and public safety improvements to Harborview Medical Center at the soonest possible election date is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health or safety or for the support of county government and its existing public institutions.

F. The Council further finds that Harborview Medical Center is a "public health and safety facility" as such term is defined in RCW 36.89.010, and finds further that the essential public health and safety services provided by this facility are of general benefit

to all of the residents of King County. To minimize disruptions in the public health and safety services provided by Harborview Medical Center, the county council therefore further finds that the best interests of all of the residents of the county require the county to undertake seismic and related health and public safety improvements to Harborview, as further described on Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (collectively, the "Improvements").

- G. In accordance with RCW 36.89.040, the county council hereby finds and declares that the proposition authorized to be submitted to the voters by this ordinance and the Improvements authorized thereby and described in this ordinance have for their object the furtherance and accomplishment of a system of public health and safety facilities for the benefit of all the residents of King County and constitute a single purpose.
- H. The cost of all necessary design, engineering and other consulting services, inspection and testing, administrative expenses, permitting and mitigation costs, and other costs incurred in connection with the Improvements shall be deemed a part of the costs of such Improvements.
- I. The total estimated cost of the Improvements, including the cost of issuing and selling the bonds provided in this ordinance, is declared to be, as nearly as may be determined, the amount of \$193,130,000.
- J. The exact specifications for projects included in the Improvements shall be determined by the county council or its designated agency. If construction of any or all of the Improvements is managed by an agency designated by the county council, such designation shall be made by agreement approved the county council before any bond

unanticipated funds from other sources are secured for the Improvements, those funds will be used for the Improvements. If the county council shall determine that it has become impractical to acquire, construct or equip any portion of the Improvements by reason of changed conditions, or costs substantially in excess of the amount of bond proceeds or other funds estimated to be available, the county shall not be required to acquire, construct or equip such portions. If all of the Improvements shall have been accomplished or duly provided for, or found to be impractical, the county may apply the bond proceeds or any portion thereof to the payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds or to other capital improvements, as the council, by ordinance and in its discretion, shall determine.

SECTION 2. Authorization of Bonds. For the purpose of providing part of the funds necessary to pay costs of the Improvements, the county shall issue and sell its general obligation bonds in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$193,130,000. Such bonds shall be issued in an amount not exceeding the amount approved by the qualified electors of the county or exceeding the amount permitted by the constitution and laws of the State of Washington. The balance, if any, of the cost of the Improvements shall be paid out of any money that the county now has or may later have on hand that is legally available for such purpose.

The bonds to be issued shall be issued in such amounts and at such time or times as found necessary and advisable by the county council. The bonds may be issued in one or more series and shall bear interest payable at a rate or rates not to exceed the maximum rate permitted by law at the time the bonds are sold, and shall mature in such

amounts and at such times within a maximum term of 20 years from date of issue, but may mature at an earlier date or dates as authorized by the county council and as provided by law. The exact date, form, terms, options of redemption, maturities and conditions of sale of the bonds shall be as hereafter fixed by ordinance of the county council passed for such purpose. The bonds shall be general obligations of the county and, unless paid from other sources, both principal of and interest on the bonds shall be payable out of annual tax levies to be made upon all the taxable property within the county without limitation as to rate or amount. After voter approval of the bond proposition and in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds, the county may issue short term obligations as authorized by Chapter 39.50 RCW.

SECTION 3. Bond Election. It is hereby found and declared that an emergency exists requiring the submission to the qualified electors of the county of a proposition authorizing the county to issue bonds for the purposes set forth in this ordinance at a special election to be held in conjunction with the general election on November 7, 2000. The King County Department of Records and Elections, as ex officio supervisor of elections, is hereby requested to find the existence of such emergency and to assume jurisdiction of and to call and conduct said special election to be held within the county and to submit to the qualified electors of the county the proposition hereinafter set forth.

EXHIBIT A

Seismic and Health and Public Safety Improvements For Harborview Medical Center

- Demolition of seismically unsound buildings
- Construction of new buildings to house services displaced from the demolished buildings, including inpatient and outpatient clinical services and the Medical Examiner's Office
- Renovation, retrofitting and expansion of existing buildings to increase seismic stability, upgrade mechanical, electrical, telecommunications and other building systems, and to increase critical health care capacity
- Street improvements, landscaping, and mitigation required in connection with the above improvements
