| 1 | AN ORDINANCE relating to interim use of the Community |
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| 2 | Development Block Grant Fund to provide a short-term |
| 3 | property acquisition loan to the city of Kent to purchase a |
| 4 | commercial property for development that will provide |
| 5 | employment opportunities to low/moderate income persons |
| 6 | and authorizing the King County executive to enter into loan |
| 7 | agreements necessary to effect the project. |
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| 10 | BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY: |
| 11 | SECTION 1. Definitions. Unless the context otherwise requires, the terms |
| 12 | defined in this section shall, for all purposes of this ordinance have the meanings specific |
| 13 | words importing the singular include the plural number and vice versa: |
| 14 | "CBDG" means Community Development Block Grant. |
| 15 | "Community Development Interim Loan" or "CDIL" means the making of short- |
| 16 | term financing loans to assist in the development of Community Development Block |
| 17 | Grant eligible projects. |

| 18 | "Community Development Block Grant funds" or "CDGB funds" means those |
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| 19 | entitlement moneys King County receives through the United States Department of |
| 20 | Housing and Urban Development and are dedicated to the CDBG Fund. |
| 21 | "Council" means the metropolitan King County council of King County, |
| 22 | Washington. |
| 23 | "County" means King County, Washington. |
| 24 | SECTION 2. The council finds and determines to be necessary and appropriate |
| 25 | and in the best interests of the county to make a CDIL in the amount of up to |
| 26 | \$10,000,000.00 to the city of Kent. The loan will be used to acquire fifteen acres of |
| 27 | underutilized commercial land to create an urban town center. The property is located in |
| 28 | downtown Kent. The development will create synergy with the nearby planned Kent |
| 29 | Civic and Performing Arts Center and commuter rail station. The project is consistent |
| 30 | with the economic development objectives of King County's adopted consolidated |
| 31 | housing and community development plan, and will result in the creation of up to four |
| 32 | hundred eighty new jobs, of which low-to-moderate income persons will hold fifty-one |
| 33 | percent. The project will enhance the CDBG fund by providing interest and fee income |
| 34 | to be used for other CDBG eligible projects. The loan shall be repaid to King County in |
| 35 | accordance with the terms and conditions of the CDIL agreement. |
| 36 | SECTION 3. In accordance with the regulations of the United States department |
| 37 | of housing and urban development, the county executive is hereby authorized to enter |

into a CDIL agreement with the city of Kent.

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SECTION 4. For the purpose of making this CDIL, the sum of \$10,000,000.00,
or so much thereof as may be necessary to fund this project, shall be disbursed from such
unexpended balances as may become available in the King County CDBG Fund.

SECTION 5. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or
circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance or the application of the
provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
