Project: 339101 Working Forest Program

Description: Provides funding for the Working Forest Program, as funded by the 1995 Arts and Natural Resources Initiative Bond. This program provides for acquisition of real property interests and development of forestry programs to preserve sustainable rural forest production lands.

Status: Forestry Program acquisition funds were used to help fund the Ring Hill acquisition. Program funds were used to develop working forestry technical assistance, outreach and education to forest landowners, and development of incentive programs.

Original Cost Estimate: \$3,000,000 (1995)

1999 Funding: \$130,000

Operating Costs: \$45,000/year
