2	the Capital Facilities Plans of the Tahoma, Federal Way,
3	Riverview, Issaquah, Snoqualmie Valley, Lake Washington,
4	Kent, Northshore, Enumclaw, Fife and Auburn school
5	districts as subelements of the capital facilities element of
6	the King County Comprehensive Plan for purposes of
7	implementing the school impact fee program; establishing
8	school impact fees to be collected by King County on behalf
9	of the districts; and amending Ordinance 10122, Section 3,
10	as amended, and K.C.C. 20.12.460, Ordinance 10470,
11	Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 20.12.461, Ordinance

26	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
27	SECTION 1. Authority. This ordinance is adopted to implement King County
28	Comprehensive Plan policies, Washington State Growth Management Act and King
29	County Ordinance 10162, with respect to Tahoma School District, Federal Way School
30	District, Riverview School District, Issaquah School District, Snoqualmie Valley School
31	District, Lake Washington School District, Kent School District, Northshore School
32	District, Enumclaw School District and Fife School District. This ordinance is necessary
33	to address identified impacts of development on the districts in order to protect the public
34	health, safety and welfare, and to implement King County's authority to impose school
35	impact fees pursuant to RCW 82.02.050 through 82.02.080.
36	SECTION 2. Ordinance 10122, Section 3, as amended, and K.C.C. 20.12.460 are

131	B. County's administrative costs. The county's costs of administering the school
132	impact fee program shall be sixty-five dollars per dwelling unit and shall be paid by the
133	applicant to the county as part of the development application fee.
134	C. Effective date. The school impact fees established in ((Ordinance 13673)) this
135	ordinance take effect on ((December 30, 1999)) January 1, 2001.
136	SECTION 14. Severability. If any provision of this ordinance or its application
137	to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance or the

application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
