1 AN ORDINANCE approving the Woodinville Water
2 District 2000 Comprehensive Water Plan.

5 **PREAMBLE:**

6 K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires approval of comprehensive plans for water utilities
7 as a prerequisite for granting right-of-way franchises and approval of right-of-way
8 construction permits.

9 The Woodinville Water District 2000 Comprehensive Water Plan (plan) discusses
10 water service to existing and future populations within the district's twenty-nine-square-
11 mile service area. The service area includes urban and rural unincorporated areas and the
12 city of Woodinville. The service area is predominantly comprised of single-family
13 residences, although commercial and industrial uses are also served.

14 The district purchases all of its water from Seattle Public Utilities. A single well
15 for emergency uses also exists. The well does not have water rights. The district
16 supports Seattle's one percent conservation initiative.

17 The King County utilities technical review committee (UTRC) reviewed and
18 conditionally approved the plan on June 21, 2000. The conditions of approval, technical
19 changes to the plan, are reflected in the plan version attached to this ordinance. The
20 UTRC recommends that the council approve the plan.

21 The district has updated the plan to revise discussions regarding the renewal of its
22 water supply contract with Seattle Public Utilities; update the district's intentions
23 regarding supplying water to the Trilogy project; and to revise the district's capital
24 improvement program. These changes are reflected in the "July 2001 Revisions" to the
25 plan.

26 The district prepared a determination of non-significance for the plan on May 15,
27 2000, in accordance with the state Environmental Policy Act.

28 The district intends to approve the plan when final county and state approval has
29 occurred.

30 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

31 SECTION 1. The clerk is hereby directed to replace pages ES-1 to ES-17, 1-1 to
32 1-32, 4.1-1 to 4.1-9, 8-1 to 8-11, and 9-1 to 9-11 with the corresponding pages from the
33 July 2001 Revisions and date the attachment July 2001.

34 SECTION 2. The Woodinville Water District 2000 Comprehensive Water Plan,

35 Attachment A to this ordinance, is hereby approved as amended.




