AN ORDINANCE proposing to amend Article 8 of the King County Charter to guarantee the free exercise of religion and absolute freedom of conscience in all matters of religious sentiment, belief and worship to every individual within King County; adding a new Section 843 to the King County Charter, and submitting the same to the voters of the county for their ratification or rejection at the November 2001 general election.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There shall be submitted to the qualified voters of King County for their approval and ratification or rejection, at the next general election to be held in this county occurring more than forty-five days after the enactment of this ordinance, an amendment to Article 8 of the King County Charter by adding new Section 843, as set forth in this ordinance.

SECTION 2. The intent of this charter amendment is to guarantee freedom of religion at the county level to the same extent as is guaranteed by Article I, Section 11 of the Washington State Constitution. It is intended that all county agencies shall accord freedom of religion to the extent required by the King County Charter, the Washington State Constitution, and the United States Constitution.

<u>NEW SECTION. SECTION 3.</u> There is hereby added to the King County Charter a new section to read as follows:

## Section 843. Freedom of religion guarantee.

Absolute freedom of conscience in all matters of religious sentiment, belief and worship, shall be guaranteed to every individual, and no one shall be molested or disturbed in person or property on account of religion; but the liberty of conscience hereby secured shall not be so construed as to excuse acts of licentiousness or justify practices inconsistent with the peace and safety of the state. No public money or property shall be appropriated for or applied to any religious worship, exercise or instruction, or the support of any religious establishment: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That this section shall not be so construed as to forbid the employment by the county of a chaplain for such of the county custodial, correctional, and mental institutions, or by a county public hospital, health care facility, or hospice, as may be allowed by law. No religious qualification shall be required for any public office or employment, nor shall any person be incompetent as a witness or juror, in consequence of his opinion on matters of religion, nor be questioned in any court of justice touching his religious belief to affect the weight of his testimony. This section shall not diminish or limit any other protections

guaranteed by Article I, Section 11 of the Washington State Constitution or by the first 39 40 amendment of the United States Constitution. SECTION 4. If any provision of this amendment to the charter, or its application 41

to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the amendment or its

application to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
