## Ordinance 14208

AN ORDINANCE relating to use of revenues from certain

**Proposed No.** 2001-0473.1

2	King County International Airport properties, requiring all
3	revenue from Lot 14 of the King County International
4	Airport to be placed in the noise containment facility
5	reserve account until certain conditions are met; and
6	declaring an emergency.

8	
9	PREAMBLE
10	King County will undertake the construction of additional hangars at King
11	County International Airport (KCIA) on the parcel of land known as Lot
12	14 for general aviation tenants. This project will be constructed in
13	coordination with a separate project to expand the Museum of Flight.
14	King County has also undertaken a significant body of work to reduce
15	noise at KCIA, including investigation of the feasibility and efficacy of
16	building an noise containment facility to reduce the noise of ground run-
17	ups of engines. King County has established a reserve CIP account to

18	fund the design and construction of such a facility if analysis proves it
19	effective and feasible.
20	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
21	SECTION 1. Findings: The county council finds that:
22	A. The reduction of noise is a high priority of King County;
23	B. Construction of additional hangars and tie-down spaces are important for
24	general aviation, and are best accomplished in conjunction with expansion of the
25	Museum of Flight, rather than at a later date. The construction schedule of the Museum
26	of Flight requires immediate action to avoid delay in the museum's project; and
27	C. Replenishment of the airport noise containment subfund 3384 is a high
28	priority.
29	SECTION 2. All revenue from the airport parcel known as Lot 14 shall be placed
30	into the airport noise containment subfund of fund 3384 until the initial commitment of
31	six million dollars for that subfund has been restored or a design and cost estimate for the
32	noise containment have been finalized.
33	SECTION 3. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency
34	exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace,
35	health or safety or for the support of county government and its existing public
36	institutions.
