1 AN ORDINANCE relating to the 2001 levy of property
2 taxes in King County for collection in the year 2002; and
3 amending Ordinance 14247, Section 2.

6 **PREAMBLE:**

7 In accordance with state law, the city of Seattle and the state of
8 Washington have separately certified to the county assessor the city and
9 state 2001 property tax levy for collection in 2002. The remaining taxing
10 districts in the county certified to the county council the levy amounts
11 desired to be imposed this year for collection in 2002.

12 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:**

13 SECTION 1. The county assessor of King County has certified to the
14 metropolitan King County council that the assessed valuation of the County of King as
15 finally equalized amounts to \$209,830,224,530 and as adjusted for senior citizens
16 exemptions provided for in RCW 84.36.381 and for omitted assessments in accordance
17 with RCW 84.40.080 is \$208,058,413,042.

18 SECTION 2. The metropolitan King County council imposes the levies necessary
19 to fund estimated expenditures for the year 2002 as listed below. These amounts do not
20 include the total of estimated revenues from sources other than taxation, including
21 available surplus and such expenditures as are to be net from bond warrant issues. In
22 accordance with state law, the King County assessor calculated a sum for property taxes
23 available to the county related to new construction, improvements to property, and any
24 increase in the assessed value of state assessed property. In calculating the amount of
25 regular property tax monies needed, the council was cognizant of this sum and it is
26 therefore included in the following levy totals.

31 SECTION 4. Ordinance 14247, Section 2, is hereby amended to read as follows:

32 For collection of the county regular property tax levy in 2002, the council hereby
33 authorizes a property tax increase of ((3,511,462)) 3,930,262 dollars over the prior year.

34 This is a percentage increase of ((1.47)) 1.64 percent. This increase is exclusive of any

35 amount resulting from new construction valued in 2001, any increase in value of state-
36 assessed property for 2001 and any amount necessary to fund tax refunds paid in 2001.
37 This increase will result in a total property tax levy of ~~((242,797,358))~~ 244,141,052
38 dollars, exclusive of the amounts referred to above.

39 SECTION 5. A. The sheriff and the prosecuting attorney each shall submit a
40 report on projected expenditures for Green river murder investigation and prosecution
41 through December 31, 2003. The executive shall submit a financial plan for funding
42 Green river murder investigation and prosecution costs through December 31, 2003.
43 These reports and financial plan shall be submitted to the council by January 31, 2002.

44 B. The sheriff and the prosecuting attorney each shall submit an annual report on
45 expenditures, including but not limited to, AFIS levy revenue expenditures, on the Green
46 river murder investigation and prosecution through September 30 of each year up to and
47 including September 30, 2004. Such report shall be submitted to the council with the
48 executive's annual King County proposed budget.


49 SECTION 6. The additional levy amount for AFIS purposes authorized by this
50 ordinance \$1,374,962, shall be used only for the purposes of AFIS expenditures related to

51 any Green river murder investigation and prosecution, including, but not limited to, the
52 current prosecution and other Green river homicides.

Ordinance 14273 was introduced on 10/29/01 and passed as amended by the Metropolitan King County Council on 12/10/01, by the following vote:




