1 AN ORDINANCE creating the Redmond-Bear Creek
2 groundwater protection committee; and adding a new
3 section to K.C.C. Chapter 9.14.

6 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
7

8 NEW SECTION. SECTION 1. There is hereby added to K.C.C. Chapter 9.14 a
9 new section to read as follows: **Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater protection**
10 **committee.** The Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater protection committee is hereby
11 created and shall continue in existence until December 31, 2004. The Redmond-Bear
12 Creek groundwater protection committee shall be referred to as "the groundwater
13 protection committee" or "the committee" throughout this chapter.

14 A. The groundwater protection committee members shall be selected from within
15 the Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater management plan area and shall consist of the
16 following representatives:

17 1. One representative from the groundwater advisory committee;

- 18 2. One representative from water purveyors;
- 19 3. Two representatives from sewer and water utilities and associations;
- 20 4. One representative from residential well users;
- 21 5. One representative from business owners;
- 22 6. One representative from commercial agriculturists;
- 23 7. One representative from each city;
- 24 8. One representative from the unincorporated area council;
- 25 9. One representative from chambers of commerce;
- 26 10. One representative from local environmental organizations.

27 B. The county shall invite each of the tribal nations with federally recognized
28 rights within the Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater management area to recommend
29 candidates for the committee. The committee shall include a representative from each
30 tribal nation with federally recognized rights within the Redmond-Bear Creek
31 groundwater management area, provided that the tribal nation provides to the county a
32 candidate for appointment to the committee.

33 C. Each county abutting the Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater management
34 plan area boundary shall be requested to provide to the county a candidate for
35 appointment to the committee on an advisory, nonvoting basis;


36 D. The Seattle-King County department of public health and the Washington
37 state departments of Ecology and Health shall be requested to provide to the county a
38 candidate for appointment to the committee on an advisory, nonvoting basis; and

39 E. Each member of the committee shall coordinate internally with the entity the
40 member represents.

County Council on 12/10/01, by the following vote:


