## Ordinance 14591

1	AN ORDINANCE relating to smallpox vaccinations
2	provided to county employees, employee absence resulting
3	therefrom, and applicability of workers compensation and
4	time loss benefits; adding a new section to KCC 3.12, and
5	declaring an emergency.

8	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY
9	SECTION 1. Findings:
10	A. Section 4 of the Homeland Security Act requires local health de

A. Section 4 of the Homeland Security Act requires local health departments to prepare for potential bioterrorism by providing smallpox vaccinations to a small number of "first responders" and to develop plans for rapid assessment and mobile case and contact investigation teams. One issue of significant concern to county employees who participate in this program is coverage for time loss they may experience as a result of side effects from the smallpox vaccine. Reactions range from mild discomfort causing a few days absence from work to serious, even life-threatening.

17	B. Although illness and pay during time loss due to reaction to the smallpox
18	vaccination would be covered under the worker's compensation program, time loss
19	payments do not begin until the fourth day of absence. If the absence is longer than
20	fourteen days, the first three days of absence will be paid under the worker's
21	compensation program. Furthermore, for some employees the worker's compensation
22	time loss payments may be less than their regular net pay.
23	C. To prevent county employees from losing pay because they agree to
24	participate in a program that is vital to the national security, this ordinance provides for a
25	supplement to worker's compensation time loss for the portion of wages not covered by
26	the worker's compensation program.
27	SECTION 2. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 3.12 a new section to read
28	as follows:
29	Smallpox vaccinations. Any employee who is immunized for smallpox and who
30	subsequently misses work for medical reasons related to the smallpox immunization shall
31	be granted paid leave without having such charged to vacation or sick leave for the period
32	the employee is unable to work due to medical complications from the immunization.
33	Paid leave shall be granted if:
34	A. The employee is a member of one or more categories of individuals covered
35	by a declaration by the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services specifying
36	the administration of smallpox countermeasures.
37	B. The employee has been authorized by the county to receive the immunization
38	in order to participate in the county's response under Section 304 of the Homeland

<b>1</b> 0	C. Any part of the leave that is covered by worker's compensation time loss shall
<b>‡</b> 1	be paid from that fund. If the amount of worker's compensation time loss payments is
12	less than the employee's regular net pay, the county will supplement the time loss
13	payment up to the level needed to equal the employee's regular net pay.
<b>1</b> 4	SECTION 3. For the reasons set forth in section 1 of this ordinance, the county
15	council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is
16	necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health or safety or for the

support of county government and its existing public institutions.
