13	not maintained SE 124th Street. The records indicate that no public funds
14	have been expended for its acquisition.
15	4. The department of transportation considers the subject portion of the
16	right-of-way useless as part of the county road system and believes the

17	public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax
18	rolls.
19	5. The right-of-way is classified as "C-Class" and, in accordance with
20	K.C.C. 14.40.020, the compensation due King County is based on fifty
21	percent of the assessed value of the subject right-of-way which was
22	determined from records of the department of assessments. King County
23	is in receipt of \$3,516.33 from the petitioner.

## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL AND ADDITIONAL ACTION REQUIRED

In order to appeal the recommendation of the Examiner, written notice of appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council with a fee of \$250.00 (check payable to King County Office of Finance) on or before April 6, 2004. If a notice of appeal is filed, the original and 6 copies of a written appeal statement specifying the basis for the appeal and argument in support of the appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council on or before April 13, 2004.

Filing requires actual delivery to the Office of the Clerk of the Council, Room 1025, King County Courthouse, 516 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the date due.
