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**STATEMENT OF FACTS:**

1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 64th  
8 Avenue Northeast hereinafter described.

2. The department of transportation notified the various utility companies  
10 serving the area and has been advised that easements were not required  
11 within the vacation area.

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3. There is no evidence that the subject portion of 64th Avenue Northeast  
13 was opened for public use or maintained by King County. The records  
14 indicate that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition.

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4. The department of transportation considers the subject portion of the  
16 right-of-way useless as part of the County road system and believes the

17 public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax  
18 rolls.

19 5. The right-of-way is classified as "C-Class" and, in accordance with  
20 K.C.C. 14.40.020, the compensation due King County is based on fifty  
21 percent of the assessed value of the subject right-of-way, which was  
22 determined from records of the department of assessments to be  
23 \$18,336.03. King County is in receipt of that amount from the petitioner.  
24 Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was  
25 opened by the office of the hearing examiner on the 22nd day of  
26 September, 2004 and closed on the 9th day of November, 2004.

27 In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation the  
28 council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King  
29 County to grant said petition.







**DEPARTMENT'S REPORT:**

The Department of Transportation's written report to the King County Hearing Examiner for Item No. V-2491 was received by the Examiner on September 8, 2004.

**PUBLIC HEARING:**

After reviewing the Department of Transportation's Report and examining available information on file

with the petition, the Examiner conducted a public hearing on the subject as follows:

The hearing on Item No. V-2491 was opened by the Examiner at 10:35 a.m., on September 22, 2004, in the Hearing Examiner's Conference Room, 400 Yesler Way, Seattle, WA 98104, and was continued for administrative purposes. The Affidavit of Publication was received on October 13, 2004. Supplemental e-mail reports and additional exhibits were received on October 26, November 8 and November 9, 2004. The hearing was closed on November 9, 2004.

**FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATION:** Having reviewed the record in this matter, the Examiner now makes and enters the following:

**FINDINGS:**

1. General Information:

Road name and location:	A portion of 64 <sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast in the vicinity of Northeast 130 <sup>th</sup> Place
Right of way classification:	"C"
Area:	2,845 sq. ft.
Compensation:	\$18,363.03

2. Except as provided below, the Examiner adopts and incorporates herein by this reference the facts set forth in the Department of Transportation's report to the King County Hearing Examiner for the September 22, 2004, public hearing and the statement of facts contained in Proposed Substitute Ordinance No. 2004-0404. The Department's report and Proposed Substitute Ordinance No. 2004-0404 will be attached to those copies of this report and recommendation that are submitted to the Metropolitan King County Council.
3. The Petitioner initially requested vacation of the entire portion of 64<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast abutting lot 4 of King County Short Plat L95S0065 (12963 – 64<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast, the Petitioner's property). That area included a portion of the improved right-of-way of 64<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast that terminates in a cul-de-sac adjacent to 12963 – 64<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast.

Review of the proposal by the King County Roads Division and the Water and Land Resources Department identified that the proposed vacation area was partially improved and that a storm water catch basin appeared to be within the proposed vacation area. In addition, easements were identified as necessary to allow for the continued provision of services by Verizon and Northshore Utilities District to properties in the area. The reviewing county agencies recommended that the area proposed for vacation be reduced to exclude the existing cul-de-sac.

In response to the agency reviews and comments, the area proposed to be vacated was revised by the Petitioner and a survey was provided. The area now proposed to be vacated is limited to that portion of the southerly half of 64<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast lying northwesterly of the "as-built" cul-de-sac having a radius of 27.5 feet. This revision has satisfied the concerns of the reviewing agencies, Verizon and Northshore Utilities District.

4. Vacation of the subject right-of-way would have no adverse effect on the provision of fire and emergency services to the subject property or surrounding area.

CONCLUSIONS:

1. The road subject to this petition is useless as part of the King County road system, and the public will be benefited by its vacation.
2. The Notice of Hearing on the report of the Department of Transportation was given as required by law, and a hearing on the report was conducted by the King County Hearing Examiner on behalf of the King County Council.
3. Maps showing the vicinity of the proposed vacation and the specific area to be vacated are Attachments 1 and 2 to this Report and Recommendation.

RECOMMENDATION:

APPROVE proposed Substitute Ordinance No. 2004-0404, a copy of which is attachment 3 to this report and recommendation.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL  
AND ADDITIONAL ACTION REQUIRED

In order to appeal the recommendation of the Examiner, written notice of appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council with a fee of \$250.00 (check payable to King County Office of Finance) *on or before November 29, 2004*. If a notice of appeal is filed, the original and 6 copies of a written appeal statement specifying the basis for the appeal and argument in support of the appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council *on or before December 3, 2004*.

Filing requires actual delivery to the Office of the Clerk of the Council, Room 1025, King County Courthouse, 516 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the date due. Prior mailing is not sufficient if actual receipt by the Clerk does not occur within the applicable time period. The Examiner does not have authority to extend the time period unless the Office of the Clerk is not open on the specified closing date, in which event delivery prior to the close of business on the next business day is sufficient to meet the filing requirement.

If a written notice of appeal and filing fee are not filed within 14 calendar days of the date of this report, or if a written appeal statement and argument are not filed within 21 calendar days of the date of this report, the Clerk of the Council shall place a proposed ordinance which implements the Examiner's recommended action on the agenda of the next available Council meeting. At that meeting, the Council may adopt the Examiner's recommendation, may defer action, may refer the matter to a Council committee, or may remand to the Examiner for further hearing or further consideration.

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
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


