1 AN ORDINANCE providing for expanded representation
2 to the King County emergency management advisory
3 committee, including the Seattle-King County department
4 of public health, the King County sheriff's office, the
5 Washington State Hospital Association and the
6 Muckleshoot and Snoqualmie tribes; and amending
7 Ordinance 13623, Section 1, as amended, and K.C.C.
8 2.36.055.

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11 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

12 SECTION 1. Ordinance 13623, Section 1, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.36.055 are
13 each hereby amended to read as follows:

14 A. The King County emergency management advisory committee is hereby
15 established. The committee shall act in an advisory capacity to the county executive,
16 council and office of emergency management on emergency management matters and
17 facilitate the coordination of regional emergency planning in King County.

18 B. The committee shall be composed of members who represent the following
19 emergency management interests, with each interest having one member except for the
20 Suburban Cities Association, which may have three members, and cities with populations
21 larger than one hundred thousand may have one member per city:

- 22 1. The Central Region Emergency Medical Services and Trauma Care Council;
- 23 2. Cities with populations larger than one hundred thousand;
- 24 3. Electric and gas utilities;
- 25 4. The financial community;
- 26 5. The King County Fire Chiefs Association;
- 27 6. The King County Fire Commissioners Association;
- 28 7. The King County Police Chiefs Association;
- 29 8. Local emergency planning committee ((s));
- 30 9. The Port of Seattle;
- 31 10. Private business and industry;
- 32 11. The Puget Sound Educational Service District;
- 33 12. The ((~~Seattle/King County~~)) King and Kitsap Counties Chapter of the
34 American Red Cross;
- 35 13. Water((-)) and sewer districts;
- 36 14. The Suburban Cities Association, which may have three members;
- 37 15. The Washington Association of Building Officials;
- 38 16. The King County executive or his or her designee;
- 39 17. The King County department of natural resources and parks; ((and))
- 40 18. The King County department of transportation;

41 19. The Seattle-King County department of public health;

42 20. The Muckleshoot Tribe;

43 21. The Snoqualmie Tribe;

44 22. The Washington State Hospital Association; and

45 23. The King County sheriff's office.

46 C. The scope and charge of the committee is to:

47 1. Advise King County on emergency management issues and facilitate
48 coordination of regional emergency planning in King County;

49 2. Assist King County in the development of programs and policies concerning
50 emergency management; and

51 3. Review and comment on proposed emergency management rules, policies or
52 ordinances before the adoption of the rules, policies or ordinances.

53 D. 1. The county executive shall appoint regular members of the committee,
54 subject to confirmation by the county council.

55 2. Individuals serving as members of the committee shall be the chair of the
56 association or designee if an association or agency is named as a member. This includes
57 the Suburban Cities Association, which shall designate the individuals to serve as its
58 representative members.

59 3. Individuals serving the committee from industry groups shall be recruited
60 with the assistance of the industry.

61 4. A member of the committee shall serve a term of three years or until the
62 member's successor is appointed and confirmed as provided in this section. The terms of
63 office shall be staggered consistent with K.C.C. chapter 2.28.

64 5. Memberships are not limited as to numbers of terms, but members shall
65 participate in a reappointment process every three years. Reappointment is subject to
66 confirmation by county council.

67 6. A vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the term of the vacant position
68 in the manner described in the initial appointment.

69 E. 1. The committee shall elect a committee member as chair by a majority vote
70 of committee members. The term of the chair is one year.

71 2. The committee shall adopt appropriate bylaws, including quorum
72 requirements.

73 F. The office of emergency management shall provide ongoing administrative

74 support to the committee.


75 G. Members of the committee shall serve without compensation.


