1	AN ORDINANCE adopting a methodology for the
2	allocation of taxicab license; authorizing the director of the
3	department of executive services to withhold certain
4	taxicab licenses; prohibiting the transfer of new taxicab
5	licenses; and amending Ordinance 10498, Section 89, as
6	amended, and K.C.C. 6.64.700 and Ordinance 10498,
7	Section 90, as amended, and K.C.C. 6.64.710.
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10	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
11	SECTION 1. Ordinance 10498, Section 89, and K.C.C. 6.64.700 are hereby
12	amended to read as follows:
13	Taxicab($(-)$) $=$ ((M)) \underline{m} aximum number.
14	A. The King County council finds that the safety, reliability and economic viability
15	of privately operated taxi transportation is a matter of county concern and regulation of that
16	type of transportation is an essential government function. The council further finds that
17	the maximum number of taxicab licenses ((in effect as of May 31, 1991, is)) sufficient to

18	provide the public adequate taxicab service is five hundred sixty-one. The council further
19	finds that some previously issued licenses have reverted to the county and that the demand
20	for service has grown to the extent that the issuance of additional taxicab licenses from
21	within the number of reverted licenses may be justified. The council further finds that the
22	escalating cost of a taxicab license as it is transferred between parties may be reflected in
23	higher costs to the customer and may diminish the owner's ability to maintain an upgrade
24	his or her vehicle.
25	B. The total number of taxicab licenses issued shall not exceed five hundred sixty-
26	one. The director also shall deny issuance of new taxicab licenses from within the
27	number of reverted licenses as specified by this section unless he or she determines that
28	there is demand for additional taxi service.
29	C. The following methodology shall be used to determine whether to issue new
30	taxicab licenses:
31	1. The director shall periodically make a determination of the need for
32	additional taxi service in areas served by King County licensed taxicabs. The viability of
33	accessible taxi service at levels established in adopted policy shall be the primary
34	consideration. Other factors to be considered include:
35	a. coordination with the city of Seattle's taxicab licensing and regulatory
36	framework;
. 37	b. growth in population, tourists and other visitors to the area;
38	c. the quality of existing taxi service as indicated by response times and
39	customer satisfaction; and
40	d. other indications of unmet demand;

41	2. Upon determining that a specific number of new taxicab licenses should be
42	issued, the director may issue all or a portion of those licenses through a request for
43	proposals process designed to test alternatives to the current local taxi industry model.
44	King County should retain the ability to revoke, reallocate or recondition those licenses
45	should the alternative model prove infeasible; and
46	3. All taxicab licenses not subject to a request for proposals process shall be
47	issued by lot from a pool of qualified applicants as determined by the director.
48	((ϵ .)) \underline{D} . The director may issue temporary taxicab licenses to wheelchair
49	accessible taxicab vehicles used to provide transportation to disabled persons who use
50	wheelchairs or other mobility devices. The temporary licenses are nontransferable and
51	shall not be included in calculating the maximum number of taxicab licenses allowable
52	pursuant to subsection B. of this section. The transit division shall coordinate a
53	demonstration project to determine the ((economic feasibility of the)) long-term
54	((issuance)) viability of wheelchair accessible taxicab((s)) service.
55	((D. The executive shall formulate and forward to the council for its approval a
56	methodology for apportioning taxicab licenses when the total number of taxicab licenses in
57	effect is less than the maximum number allowed. The executive shall submit this
58	information to the council no later than March 1, 2006.))
59	E. In order to test alternative ways of structuring taxi associations and the terms
60	of taxicab license leases, the director may issue licenses on condition that the licensees
61	make specific commitments or perform specific actions not generally required of other
62	licensees. The director shall establish the special conditions through the administrative
63	rule making process in accordance with K.C.C. chapter 2.98. The director may revise the

conditions applied to such licenses or revoke and reissue the licenses upon determining that the conditions have not been met or that they will not achieve the objectives of the alternative being tested.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 10498, Section 90, as amended, and K.C.C. 6.64.710 are amended to read as follows:

Transfer or sale of license.

A. Transfer or sale of a license <u>issued before January 1, 2006</u>, to any other person is authorized, except that temporary wheelchair accessible taxicab licenses <u>and all taxicab licenses issued after January 1, 2006</u>, are nontransferable. Application for transfer of a ((permit)) <u>license</u> to another person shall include the name of the transferee, and the trade name and color scheme under which the vehicle will be operated, the sales price and other information required by the director. The transferee shall comply with all requirements of this chapter. Any transfer of a taxicab license shall be for the transfer of all licenses issued to the vehicle. If the transfer is for one vehicle license only, the remaining taxicab license shall be considered abandoned, nonrenewable or nontransferable.

B. Unless suspended or revoked, taxicab license may be renewed annually

- 81 <u>subject to timely payment of license fees and compliance with other relevant provisions</u>
- 82 of this chapter.
