A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of the South 7 370th Street right-of-way, dedicated as 9th Street, hereinafter described. 2. The department of transportation notified the various utility companies 8 serving the area and has been advised that easements have either been 9 obtained or are not required within the vacation area. 10 3. A utility easement, for the Lakehaven Utility District, has been 11 recorded under King County recording number 20080102000240, records 12 of King County, Washington. 13 4. The department of transportation records indicate that King County has 14 not been maintaining the South 370th Street right-of-way. The records 15 indicate that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition. A

19	5. The department of transportation considers the subject portion of the
20	right-of-way useless as part of the county road system and believes the
21	public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax

24	K.C.C. 14.40.020, the compensation due King County is based on fifty
25	percent of the assessed value of the subject right-of-way, which was
26	determined from records of the department of assessments. King County

28	Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was
29	held by the office of the hearing examiner on the 20th day of February.
30	In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation the
31	council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King
32	County to grant said petition.
33	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
34	SECTION 1. The council, on the effective date of this ordinance, hereby vacates
35	and abandons that portion of the South 370th Street right-of-way as conveyed to King
36	County by the recording of the Plat of Jovita Addition recorded in Volume 19 of Plats,
37	Page 14, records of King County, Washington as described below:
38	That portion of the southerly thirty (30) feet of South 370th
39	Street (dedicated as 9th Street) abutting and adjacent to the

40	north line of Lot 1, Block 37, in the Plat of Jovita Addition,
41	recorded in Volume 19 of Plats, Page 14, records of King
42	County, Washington, and said north line's easterly
43	extension to the centerline of 50th Avenue South (dedicated
44	as Colorado Avenue.)

DEPARTMENT'S REPORT:

The Department of Transportation's written report to the King County Hearing Examiner for Item No. V-2589 was received by the Examiner on January 24, 2008.

PUBLIC HEARING:

After reviewing the Department's Report and examining available information on file with the petition, the Examiner conducted a public hearing on the subject as follows:

The hearing on Item No. V-2589 was opened by the Examiner on February 20, 2008, in the Hearing Examiner's Conference Room, 400 Yesler Way, Seattle, WA 98104. The hearing was continued administratively for receipt of an affidavit of the required Notice of Hearing and recording of the Utility Easement, copies of which were received March 4, 2008 and March 10, 2008 respectively. Participants at the public hearing and the exhibits offered and entered are listed in the attached minutes. A verbatim recording of the hearing is available in the office of the Hearing Examiner.

<u>FINDINGS</u>, <u>CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATION</u>: Having reviewed the record in this matter, the Examiner now makes and enters the following:

- 4. Maps showing the vicinity of the proposed vacation and the specific area to be vacated appear in the hearing record as exhibit nos. 6, 7 and 8.
- 5. The subject right-of-way segment is not currently opened, constructed or maintained for public use, and is not known to be used informally for access to any property.
- 6. Vacation of the right-of-way would have no adverse effect on the provision of access and fire and emergency services to the abutting subject property and surrounding area.
- 7. The right-of-way is not necessary for the present or future public road system for travel or utilities purposes.
- 8. No easements are necessary to be retained for the construction, repair and maintenance of public utilities and services.

9. The compensation required by law to be paid as a condition precedent to vacation of this road has been deposited with King County.

CONCLUSION:

1. The right-of-way segment subject to this petition is useless as part of the King County road system, and the public will be benefited by its vacation.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL AND ADDITIONAL ACTION REQUIRED

In order to appeal the recommendation of the Examiner, written notice of appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council with a fee of \$250.00 (check payable to King County Office of Finance) on or before March 24, 2008. If a notice of appeal is filed, the original and six (6) copies of a written appeal statement specifying the basis for the appeal and argument in support of the appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council on or before March 31, 2008.

Filing requires actual delivery to the Office of the Clerk of the Council, Room 1025, King County Courthouse, 516 3rd Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the date due. Prior mailing is not sufficient if actual receipt by the Clerk does not occur within the applicable time period. The Examiner does not have authority to extend the time period unless the Office of the Clerk is not open on the specified closing date, in which event delivery prior to the close of business on the next business day is sufficient to meet the filing requirement.

If a written notice of appeal and filing fee are not filed within 14 days calendar days of the date of this report, or if a written appeal statement and argument are not filed within 21 calendar days of the date of this report, the Clerk of the Council shall place a proposed ordinance which implements the Examiner's recommended action on the agenda of the next available Council meeting. At that meeting, the Council may adopt the Examiner's recommendation, may defer action, may refer the matter to a Council committee, or may remand to the Examiner for further hearing or further consideration.

Action of the Council Final. The action of the Council on a recommendation of the Examiner shall be final and conclusive unless within twenty-one (21) days from the date of the action an aggrieved party or person applies for a writ of certiorari from the Superior Court in and for the County of King, State of Washington, for the purpose of review of the action taken.
