**PRELIMINARY REPORT:**

The Department of Natural Resources & Parks, Water and Land Resources Division Report on item no. E08CT093 was received by the Examiner on February 20, 2009.

**PUBLIC HEARING:**

After reviewing the report and examining available information on file with the application, the Examiner conducted a public hearing on the application as follows:

The hearing on item no. E08CT093 was held by the Examiner on March 4, 2009, in the Hearing Examiner's Conference Room, 400 Yesler Way, Room 404, Seattle, Washington.

Participants at the public hearing and the exhibits offered and entered are listed in the attached minutes. A verbatim recording of the hearing is available in the office of the King County Hearing Examiner.

**FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATION:** Having reviewed the record in this matter, the Examiner now makes and enters the following:

**FINDINGS:**

1. **General Information:**

Owners: Colin, Cheri, Dennis & Jamie Stefani

Location: 31201 NE 104<sup>th</sup> Street, Carnation

PBRS categories requested: **Open Space Resources**  
 Aquifer protection area  
 Surface water quality buffer  
 Watershed protection area

Categories recommended: **Open Space Resources**

 Significant wildlife or salmonid habitat  
 Surface water quality buffer (conditional)

 Resource restoration (conditional)

STR: SW 33-26-07

 Parcel no.: 332607-9012  
 Total acreage: 11.36  
 Recommended PBRS: 4.46

(The land area recommended for PBRS enrollment is the entire parcel less the excluded area, which is what has been calculated by DNRP. In the event the County Assessor's official parcel size is revised, the PBRS acreage shall be administratively adjusted to reflect that change.)

2. Except as modified herein, the facts set forth in the King County Department of Natural Resources & Parks, Water and Land Resources Division, Preliminary Report for the March 4, 2009, public hearing are found correct and are incorporated herein by reference. Copies of the department report will be provided with the copies of this report submitted to the Metropolitan King County

Council.

3. Timely application was made to King County for PBRS current use valuation of the property to begin in 2010. Notice of the application was given as required by law.
4. The property contains priority open space resources and is eligible for a total award of 10 points under the King County Public Benefit Rating System. The resulting current use valuation therefore would be 50% of market value for 4.46 acres of the property.
5. Additional credit may be awarded administratively under the surface water quality buffer and resource restoration categories.

If credit is awarded under the resource restoration category and the acreage marked in blue on exhibit no. 4 is included in the enrolled acreage, then credit may also be awarded under the surface water quality buffer category.

Award of credit under the resource restoration category is subject to Applicant submittal of a restoration plan by July 1, 2009, and subsequent approval by August 1, 2009. The restoration plan must address the eradication of invasive plant species and the replanting of native trees and shrubs in the areas needed, within the first three years of enrollment.

Credit under these categories will increase the total point award to 20 points with a resultant current use valuation of 30% for the enrolled portion of the property, and the enrolled acreage will increase to 5.21 acres.

CONCLUSION:

1. Approval of current use valuation of 50% of market value (or as low as 30%) for 4.46 acres (or up to 5.21 acres) of the property pursuant to the Public Benefit Rating System adopted by Chapter 20.36 KCC would be consistent with the purposes and intent of King County to maintain, preserve, conserve and otherwise continue in existence adequate open space lands and to assure the use and enjoyment of natural resources and scenic beauty for the economic and social well-being of King County and its citizens.

RECOMMENDATION:

APPROVE current use valuation of 50% of market value (or as low as 30%) for 4.46 acres (or up to 5.21 acres) of the property, subject to the conditions recommended in the Department of Natural Resources & Parks report for the March 4, 2009 public hearing and the following conditional allowance:

- A. Credit may be awarded administratively under the surface water quality buffer and resource restoration categories as stated in Finding no. 5 above. Award of credit under these categories would increase the point total to 20 points with a current use valuation of 30% for the enrolled portion of the property and increase the enrolled acreage to 5.21 acres.

Current use valuation shall be subject to all terms and conditions of RCW Chapter 84.34 and KCC

Chapter 20.36, as may be amended from time to time, and all regulations and rules duly adopted to implement state law and county ordinances pertaining to current use valuation.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL  
AND ADDITIONAL ACTION REQUIRED**

In order to appeal the recommendation of the Examiner, written notice of appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council with a fee of \$250.00 (check payable to King County Office of Finance) *on or before March 26, 2009*. If a notice of appeal is filed, the original and 6 copies of a written appeal statement specifying the basis for the appeal and argument in support of the appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council *on or before April 2, 2009*. Appeal statements may refer only to facts contained in the hearing record; new facts may not be presented on appeal.

Filing requires actual delivery to the Office of the Clerk of the Council, Room 1025, King County Courthouse, 516 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the date due. Prior mailing is not sufficient if actual receipt by the Clerk does not occur within the applicable time period. The Examiner does not have authority to extend the time period unless the Office of the Clerk is not open on the specified closing date, in which event delivery prior to the close of business on the next business day is sufficient to meet the filing requirement.

If a written notice of appeal and filing fee are not filed within 14 days calendar days of the date of this report, or if a written appeal statement and argument are not filed within 21 calendar days of the date of this report, the Clerk of the Council shall place a proposed ordinance which implements the Examiner's recommended action on the agenda of the next available Council meeting. At that meeting, the Council may adopt the Examiner's recommendation, may defer action, may refer the matter to a Council committee, or may remand to the Examiner for further hearing or further consideration.

Action of the Council is final. The action of the Council on a recommendation of the Examiner shall be final and conclusive unless within twenty-one (21) days from the date of the action an aggrieved party or person applies for a writ of certiorari from the Superior Court in and for the County of King, State of Washington, for the purpose of review of the action taken.

- g) Removal of land classified as farm and agricultural land under RCW 84.34.020(2)(e).
  - h) Removal of land from classification after enactment of a statutory exemption that qualifies the land for exemption and receipt of notice from the owner to remove the land from classification.
  - i) The creation, sale, or transfer of forestry riparian easements under RCW 76.13.120.
  - j) The creation, sale, or transfer of a fee interest or a conservation easement for the riparian open space program under RCW 76.09.040.
  - k) The sale or transfer of land within two years after the death of the owner of at least a fifty percent interest in the land if the land has been assessed and valued as forest land under chapter 84.33 RCW, or under chapter 84.34 RCW continuously since 1993. The date of death shown on the death certificate is the date used.
8. The county assessor may require an owner to submit data relevant to continuing the eligibility of any parcel of land described in this agreement.
  9. The owner may apply for reclassification as provided in Chapter 84.34 RCW.
  10. This agreement shall supersede any previous open space taxation agreement entered into for the subject property.

This agreement shall be subject to the following conditions:
